Laughs and Thrills Featured in 'The Live Wire'

The patrons of the Arcade Theatre are being given a rare treat this week in "The Live Wire," a First National picture starring Johnny Hines, the highly popular comedian, and produced by C. C. Burr.

Hines gives a splendid account of himself in this ingeniously humorous comedy and thrill drama. This cleverly served comedian is at his best in this feature, for the action carries him into no end of amusing situations that bring continuous waves of laughter from the audience.

"The Live Wire" starts out with a punch when Johnny is seen as the star performer of a circus, and successfully keeps up the high tension when this likable star becomes a knight of the royal mail and makes good as a lamp and an unassuming park proposition that ultimately is the means of frustrating the villainous attempts of the "heavies" and winning the girl of his dream.

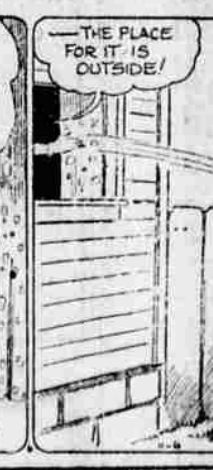

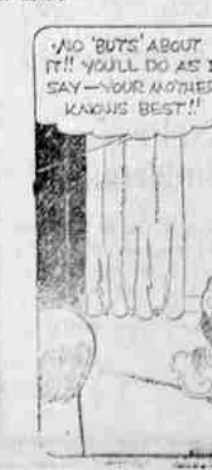
