METEORIC GRANGE.
It required "Red" Grange of Illinois to bring back some of the waning prestige of the west in football.

Prior to the entrance of Red Grange into eastern grid circles, the athletes of that section were on the top of the world. Some of the experts hinted that once again the east was supreme.

The Army had decisively defeated Notre Dame, team coached by Knute Rockne, for years long regarded as well nigh unshakable. Even though it was a well known fact that the Notre Dame team of this year was green and below Rockne standard, the victory of the Army, 27-0, was a most impressive one.

Next, Pennsylvania, conqueror of Yale, trimmed Chicago, Western conference champion of last year. Another great victory for the east, for was not Chicago the best team in the "Big Ten"?

The fact that Ohio State had beaten the highly touted Columbia eleven, 9-0, was lost sight of in the two great victories scored by the Army and Pennsylvania.

But for "Red" Grange this probably would have been an eastern grid year by a wide margin. Now it is another story; the west is back on the football may with a loud bang.

A FLAMING ARROW.

Every year at Illinois, Grange, always brilliant, has risen to great heights in one particular game. Last year it was Michigan.

The Wolverines, boasting a great team that had been coached to stop Grange, was run ragged by the brilliant halfback. In the first 12 minutes of play he scored four touchdowns. Then he retired. Later he came back, made a fifth touchdown and was responsible for still another.

It was a tough break for Penn that Grange had to have his big game of the season against them. Up to date Grange has not been quite the meteoric "Red" of 1924, but a week prior to the Penn game, Michigan, bent an revenge.

DARTMOUTH IS BEST SCORER

NEW YORK (AP)—Dartmouth not only dominates the eastern football arena as her team prepares this week to invade Chicago in quest of national laurels, but the big green scoring machine through untimely perfection of its forward passing attack, has revealed itself as one of the mightiest scoring machines of the modern game.

Standing at the top of the eastern list with an unblemished plate, Dartmouth has rolled up 207 points in seven games, an average of approximately 44 for each contest, while opponents have been let down with an average of only three points.

The Green's latest exploit has been to average more than a point a minute against such first rate opponent as Cornell, whose Double-coached forces themselves said the modern high scoring record.

Back in 1921, with George Pfann and Eddie Kase, all-American stars, leading the attack, Cornell ran up 392 points in eight contests, an average of nearly 50 points a game. The University of California amassed 397 points in 1922, but it took the gold bears nine games to do this so that their average of 44 is comparable more to Dartmouth's mark than Cornell's.

Average may shrink. Dartmouth's scoring average may shrink a bit this week against Chicago, if the latter's defense is able to cope with the Green's aerial drive. But the Hanover eleven should have little trouble staying at the top of the list on this side of the Rockies. Beyond that barrier, Southern California rolled up 350 points so far in eight games, appears certain of setting the pace nationally.

While Dartmouth is seeking Chicago's scalp, Yale and Penn pick up the fight this week to gain some of the rapidly dwindling portion of eastern gridiron glory. These two eleven's alone appear to have a chance of disputing the Green's claim to the mythical eastern title but to do that, Yale must score convincingly over Princeton and Harvard while Penn must conquer Pittsburg and Cornell. Neither has an easy assignment but Yale's chances of strengthening her position seem the most favorable.

Syracuse and Colgate, both tied once but sharing with Dartmouth the distinction of being unbeaten also meet in their annual struggle next Saturday to decide which will stay in the vanguard of the eastern army.

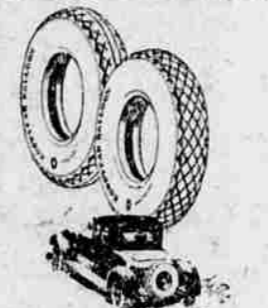
