SUBMARINE DISASTER CLAIMS 68

British Undersea Boat M-1 Lying Disabled on Ocean Bottom

EXPERTS HOLD NO HOPES OF RESCUE

Craft Too Deep for Diving or to Raise to Surface; Crew Is Facing a Lingering Death.

LONDON (By the Associated Press)—An admiralty statement this afternoon expresses doubt concerning the accuracy of the report that the M-1 had been located. The statement says "the admiralty has not received any intelligence enabling them to give credence to the report that the submarine has been located."

PLYMOUTH, England, (By the Associated Press)—The submarine M-1 was located today on the bed of the sea 12 miles southwest of Start Point, Devonshire. There is a slight chance that members of the crew are still alive.

The submarine, which disappeared during maneuvers in the channel yesterday, is said to be lying at too great a depth to permit either diving operation or attempts to raise her to the surface.

If members of the crew are alive, experts say, they face a terrible lingering death, as the boat is too large and in too deep water to permit raising her.

EARTH TREMOR SHAKES MANILA

WASHINGTON (By the Associated Press)—A serious earthquake, apparently centering a great distance from Washington, was recorded today at Georgetown, a seismograph.

The shock began at 6:12 a. m. and was still in progress at 2:40 a. m. Experts described it as "very severe."

Allowing for difference in time, this quake was identical with one felt at Manila at 8:15 tonight. Manila is 13 hours ahead of Washington time.

Manila reports said that the shock was believed to center 300 miles from there. Buildings were shaken perceptibly at Manila.
