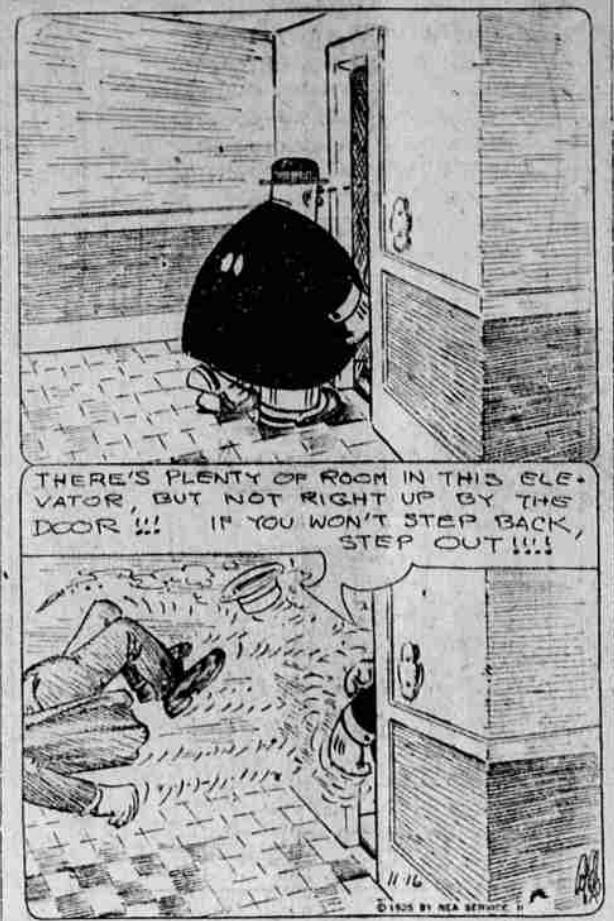
The scholarships, each valued at \$500, are available to Carnegie Tech students. They are the gift of the National Association of Master Plumbers and the Women's auxiliary.

ROME (AP)—The police have found that many of the sort and most pathetic appearing street beggars are some of the city's most opulent citizens behind the walls of their homes.
