**France Is Fooling With Buzz Saw, Writer Says**

WASHINGTON, (NEA Special)—You need maps of northern Africa and southwestern Asia to understand fully why official Washington feels so little disposed to grant debt concessions to the French while they stick to their present imperialistic policy in those two parts of the world.

If ever a country monkeyed with a buzz saw, as government heads here see it, France is doing it now in the Tiff and Syria, and still more unfortunately, not to her own danger alone, but to others' danger, too.

Why help her financially to increase the risk? Why not, rather, make it as hard as possible for her to keep it up?

By your map, you'll see that extreme northwest Africa, except for the internationalized zone of Tangier, belongs to Spain. This country, where the tribesmen are in arms against the Spanish and La Grande football game.

The various committees having the preparations for Union's annual fathers and sons meeting in charge have made practically all the necessary arrangements for the big feed and program to be held at the K. **Tango May Be Last Gasp In Rhythm But Visitors Shun It**

PARIS, (AP)—Dancing masters, and especially dancing mistresses, have advised that the tango must be danced; that it is the last gasp in rhythm and the poetry of motion. But dancers are lost on most of the sidewalks in Paris. Even Frenchmen shun it.

Spaniards and South Americans make a majority of the dancers in fashionable clubs and cafes when the tango comes on. This is especially true at afternoon dances, when

most of the participants are not in formal dress. Street clothes and the tango do not go well together and it cannot be done at all in Oxford bags.

One American girl who refused the tango at a tea party laughingly apologized: "I have given it up. I have decided that it could only be danced with some man one is desperately in love with and should be done on an secluded verandah in the moonlight. It is hard to stage it properly."

**Variety of Corks Affects London's Champagne Market**

LONDON (AP)—Used champagne bottle corks are collected by waiters in large restaurants here as eagerly as are tips. The corks are worth money and figure strongly in the quotations on the champagne market.

Wine merchants established a cork clearing house that is known to all city cote waiters. It is designed to boom the particular brands of champagne which the wholesalers or retailers want to "unload."

Waiters in all the large restaurants where champagne is served receive daily quotations on the clearing house rates. The cork prices vary from two pence to six pence each. The price of corks fluctuates weekly according to the brand of the wine and its popularity.

At times when sales of any brand show signs of falling off the price of its cork rises as an incentive to waiters to aid in stimulating the sale of this particular kind. Waiters everywhere here now collect champagne bottle corks as eagerly as they do tips.
