Southern Baptist Baptisms Set New Evangelistic Mark

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—With the administering of 1,027,550 baptisms by the Southern Baptist church during the last five years a new evangelistic record for all evangelical denominations has been established, said Dr. E. P. All-mirrors.

Dr. Allredge said that this is an average of 207,510 baptisms annually for the five years of 1920-24 inclusive, and 48 baptisms for every daylight hour.

The highest previous record of Southern Baptists in baptisms was 714,333 for the five-year period of 1915-19, inclusive.
