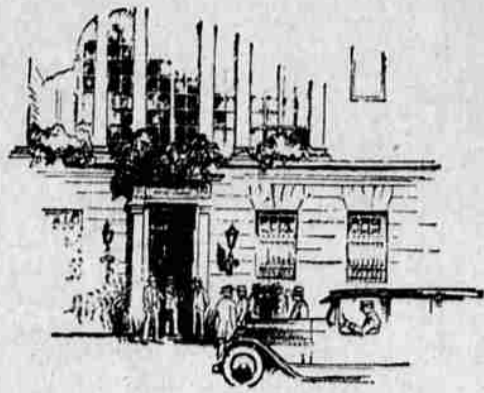

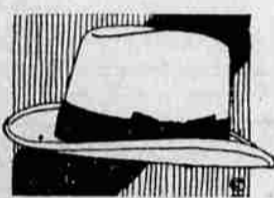

ROSEBURG BUDGET \$10,428.23

ROSEBURG, Ore.—Roseburg will levy \$27,428.23 in taxes to meet her regular budget and \$2000 to create a sinking fund for library and fire truck bonds voted recently, according to the certificate made by the city recorder to County Treasurer Calkins. "This tax is about one mill higher than last year, the rate being expected to be about 19.5 mills, although the exact rate for the tax cannot be determined until the city valuation is ascertained. The valuation, however, is expected to be around \$1,000,000, about \$200,000 higher than last year.
