Hayakawa Has Role In "The Danger Line" At Sherrys Today

"The Danger Line" at Sherrys today only marks the return to the screen of Sessue Hayakawa, brilliant and distinguished actor, after an absence of more than two years.

Mr. Hayakawa is supported in "The Danger Line" by his pretty and dainty wife, Tsuru Aoki, and both give an unusually fine performance in their respective roles.

Mr. Hayakawa was recently interviewed, and his views on life and love are most interesting:

"Take for example, the case of the husband in 'The Danger Line'," he said, "he loved his wife deeply, and knew that she loved him. Screen Veterans Play "Siege" At Star

A history of the motion picture industry might have been written by the members of the cast of "Siege," the Universal-Jewel starring Virginia Valli and Eugene O'Brien, which is now showing at the Star theatre.

Stare Madigan, former stage actor and one of the screen's first big stars, is a prominent member of the cast. He might well prepare a history of the films, for he has been in them since the days of Lubin, Essanay, World Film, Tanhausser and the other big producing companies of the past.

Virginia Valli, co-starring in "Siege," started her film career when very young; she haunted the casting offices of studios in

Chicago for months and was informed by casting directors—who have since departed—that she was "impossible" for pictures. She did her first work for the old DeWany Company, which is now only a memory in the mind of the bustling picture business.

Eugene O'Brien, for years a star on Broadway, was introduced to the screen in the early days of the Selatic Pictures Corp., with whom he was starred in his own productions. He has been in pictures for eight years.

Mary Alden, prominent screen character actress, who has one of the greatest roles of her career in "Siege," was introduced to the screen by D. W. Griffith about the time when he was making his biggest successes, "The Birth of a Nation" and "Intolerance."

Henry Fowick, another member of the supporting cast, was a member of the stock company of the old Edison company, producing in New York in 1912, and played in pictures with Mary Fuller. Incidentally, Charles Brabin, now a Universal director, was manager of the studio.

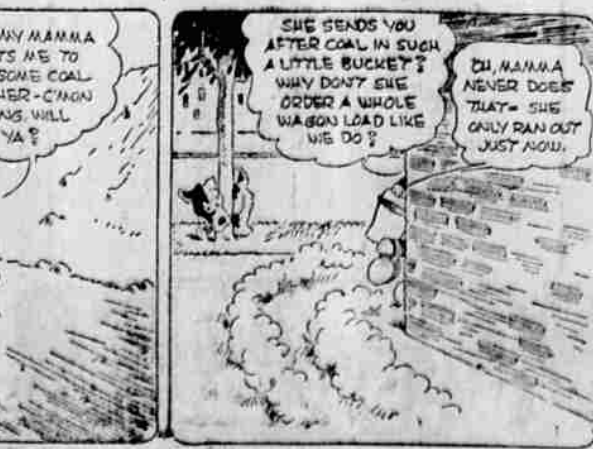
