Play By Play Account Of  
Union-La Grande Grid Game

(By Scoop)

La Grande kicked off to Union, who fumbled but recovered on its 40-yard line. Two plunges netted one foot, and Union punted. The play was recalled and La Grande penalized 5 yards for off-side. Union gained one yard and first down, placing the ball on Union's 25-yard line. Sherwood and Price returned 20 yards. Again the play was recalled, and La Grande penalized 5 yards for off-side, giving Union first down. A smash on La Grande's right side netted three and another four yards. Cox tore through for six and first down on La Grande's 44-yard line. Sherwood replaced Harrison.

Union gained 5 yards but the play was recalled and Union penalized 15 yards for holding. Price intercepted a pass and was downed on midfield. A plunge netted one yard and Glass skirted and for 20 yards and first down, placing the ball on Union's 25-yard line. Sherwood and Price gained 4 yards in two plays, but Price fumbled. Fugit recovered, and moved to La Grande's 20-yard line, when Faus dove down him from behind. The ball was recalled and given to La Grande, because the referee's whistle had been blown prior to the fumble. On the next play Price was thrown for a 3-yard loss. Strand attempted a place kick from the 45-yard line, failing. Union fumbled, Cullen recovering, giving La Grande the ball on Union's 11-yard line. Within striking distance Price failed to gain, and Glass lost 4 yards as the quarter ended. Score: Union 0, La Grande 0.

Second Quarter

La Grande, taking the ball on Union's 15-yard line attempted a pass, which Union intercepted on its 8-yard line. Casper punted 35 yards, Glass returning 7 yards to Union's 44-yard line. Price gained 4, Faus none, and Price attempting to pass, was tackled for a 10-yard loss. Price punted 40 yards. Union taking the ball on its 20-yard line, Union fumbled but recovered for a 7-yard gain. A 5-yard plunge was called back and Union penalized 5 yards for off-side. Cox tore off a 7-yard gain, and the next play netted 2 for first down. After a 2-yard advance, Zundel threw a maroon back for a 2-yard loss, which Cox recovered on the next play. Casper punted 30 yards out of bounds to La Grande's 32-yard line. Price gained 5 around end, Faus hit the line for one yard, and Glass advanced 8 through the line on a sneak play, for first down. Sherwood smashed the line for seven yards, placing the ball at midfield. Time out for Gilmore, Glass fumbled, Union recovered. Time out for Glass, Cox skirted end for 8 yards, then hit the line for 14 yards. The next play netted 4 more but was recalled and Union penalized 15 yards for holding. Union, after a 5-yard gain, punted, Fugit kicking 35 yards. With the ball on its 5-yard line, La Grande tried one line play, Glass advancing the pigskin 2 yards. Price punted 50 yards. Union returning to the 27-yard line within scoring distance, Cox tore through the line for 5 yards, another play netted one, and time was called out for Sherwood as the half ended. Score: Union 0, La Grande 0.

Third Quarter

La Grande kicked off to Union's 27-yard line. Time out for Hughes, Cox smashed the line for 6 yards and a team mate lost 5. Fugit attempted to kick but a Union back accidentally blocked it, causing a fumble which La Grande recovered on Union's 15-yard line. Three plays failed to net a yard, and Glass drop kicked a field goal from the 20-yard line.

Union kicked off to La Grande's 10-yard line. Price punted 20 yards out of bounds. Strand threw Union for a 3-yard loss, a pass gained 4 yards, and Cox added 5 more for first down. A pass was grounded, Richardson punted 23 yards and Union was penalized 15 yards for holding. Price intercepted a pass on La Grande's 35-yard line, and then skirted the end for 5 yards. Time out for Union. Glass punched the line for 7 on a motor sneak, Sherwood gained one, and Faus tore through center for 3 yards and first down. Faus continued, Glass 4, and Goertzen replaced Taylor. Sherwood advanced 3 for first down, followed by a 5-yard off-side gain by Faus, placing the ball on Union's 25-yard line, within scoring distance. Union stiffened and Price was held to one yard. On the next play La Grande was penalized 5 yards for off-side. Two attempts to pass failed, and both teams were penalized. Another pass was grounded and Union took the ball on downs. Cox gained 4 yards as the quarter ended. Score: Union 0, La Grande 0.

Fourth Quarter

Two plunges netted 4 yards and Casper punted to Price, who was tackled on La Grande's 35-yard line. Glass lost 2 on the next play, and Faus recovered the yardage. Faus slipped away for a 20-yard run. With the ball on Union's 25-yard line, four plays fell short of first down, and Union again took the ball. A pass failed, Cox gained 3 yards, another pass failed, and Casper punted 25 yards. Glass gained 5 but was called back and La Grande penalized 5 yards for

off-side. Sherwood gained 26 yards. On the next play, Sherwood tossed the ball short of Price on a pass-back end run, and Union recovered on La Grande's 20-yard line. The next play netted Union 13 yards around end, Cox hit the line for one, and another plunge netted one. Courtney replaced Landry. On the next play Union rushed the ball 8 yards to a touch-down, but failed to convert.

Union kicked off and La Grande rushed to a desperate aerial attack from its 20-yard line. Two passes were grounded and a third successful. Union was penalized 15 yards, giving La Grande the ball on Union's 32-yard line. Another pass failed. Faus gained 5 yards, and Zundel raved 22 yards on a cross, cross only to be called back. La Grande was penalized 15 yards for holding, and prevented from scoring. Another pass failed. Union kicked a punt and recovered. Union, after an 8-yard gain, was penalized 5 yards for stalling. Cox was thrown for 5 yards loss on the next, which was followed by another 2-yard setback. Casper punted to Glass who returned 8 yards to the 45-yard line. A pass was intercepted by Union. Cox gained 5 yards. Snyder replaced Price. Union failed to gain, and La Grande was penalized 5 yards for off-side. Just before the final whistle Union hit the line for 4 yards gain and first down on La Grande's 40-yard line. Final score: Union 6, La Grande 2.

for small gains and no gains every now and then. Hughes, as in other games, led his mates. The line-men as a whole played an excellent game despite slight advantage with their opponents.

In total yardage gained, La Grande excelled with 138 to Union's 122. Party of La Grande's yards came from two 20-yard runs, however, one by Glass and one by Faus. In yardage lost La Grande had 19 and Union 17.

Price, punting for La Grande, booted three times for a total gain of 123 yards. Casper and Fugit kicked six times for 182 yards. Once Price sent the ball 56 yards, the longest punt seen on the local gridiron this year.

Breaks Decided Game  
From the first it was seen that the breaks would decide the winner. La Grande and Union both scored after breaks and La Grande led once when, had it had the punch, a touchdown would have put the game on ice.

Just before the first quarter ended, La Grande failed to make the necessary yardage and Strand attempted a place kick from the 45-yard line, the ball falling short. Union fumbled and Cullen recovered on Union's 11-yard line. Price failed to gain, Glass was thrown for a four-yard loss and the quarter ended.

In the second, taking the ball on Union's 15-yard line, a La Grande pass was intercepted, ending a two-point chance to score. Standing the game up, Union's victory came because it had the

ability to score when the opportunity offered, while La Grande was unable to do so even though more yardage from scrimmage was made. In the punch La Grande failed to exhibit play that could pierce the impenetrable Union defense.

Both student bodies spent the night during half time. The spirit shown by the high schools of both towns was courteous and sportsmanlike to the nth degree. Townpeople from both La Grande and Union, however, criticized the officiating at times.
