**Volstead Act Fails, Moderationists Say**

(Continued from Page One.)  
It had risen to a total of 498,752. A corresponding increase was noted in the replies from 457 communities where records of arrests for drunkenness had been kept only since 1920, the report continues. In 1920 the total for these places was 255,274, while in 1924 it was shown to have risen to 565,026.  
"A noteworthy feature," the report comments, "is that during the 1918-1919 restrictions (which amounted to semi-dryness, not bone-dryness), there was an enormous decrease in drunkenness in spite of the business boom of those years; and that thereafter, during the severe bone-dry years of the Volstead act, there was such an astonishing increase that drunkenness just about reached the level of the old saloon years by 1924."  
The increase in the number of drunken drivers as shown by records of such cities as separate from this class from the general intoxication arrests, is classed in the report "as perhaps the most curious result of national bone-dryness."  
"The number of drunken drivers before national prohibition," observes the report "was more or less constant from year to year, showing only slight fluctuations with a tendency toward a gradual increase in the number of automobiles. Coincident, however, with the enactment of the Volstead Act, which became effective at the end of 1919, drunken drivers began to increase amazingly, and the increase has continued year by year since then."  
"The result, unfortunately, has been precisely the contrary to what the prohibitionists intended and prophesied."
