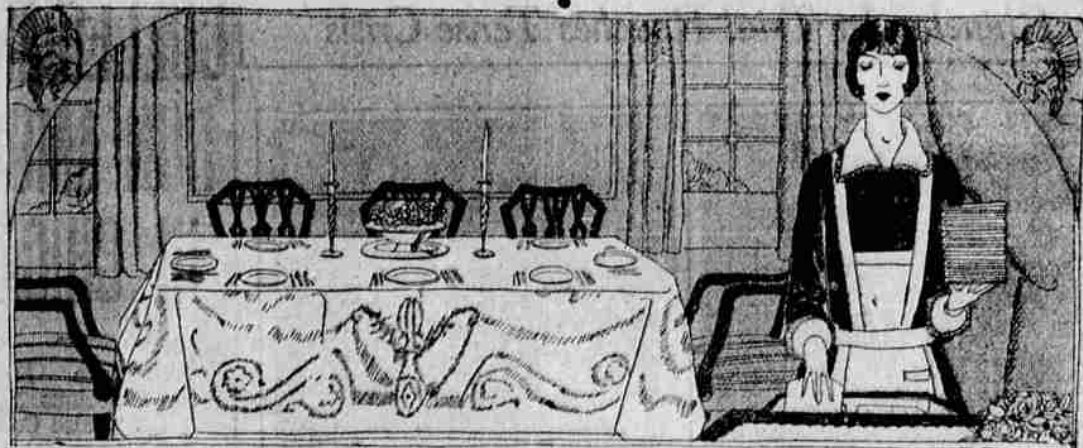


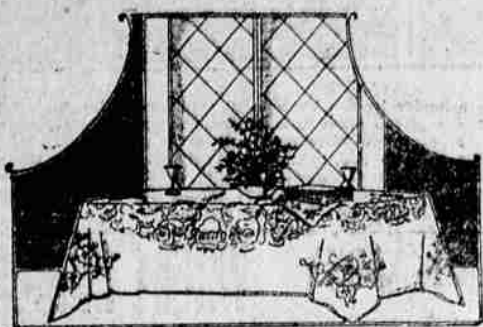

## BAKER READY FOR STRUGGLE

**BAKER, Ore. (Special)**—The high school football championship of Eastern Oregon will be at stake when the Baker Copperjackets and the La Grande Tigers clash on the Baker field Thanksgiving day.

Baker's record is far the more impressive of the two teams, having won all of its games thus far, while the Tigers have suffered two defeats, one at the hands of the Boise Braves and the other a 6-to-3 beating inflicted by the lanky Union aggregation. Baker defeated Union, 12 to 0, earlier in the season. If La Grande should conquer the golden Bulldogs here Thursday, three teams, Union, La Grande and Baker would be tied for championship honors, each having been beaten once by an Eastern Oregon team, while victory for Baker will give the local team an undisputed claim for the championship. The Bakerites are in prime condition for this struggle with their traditional rival, who has three times in succession forced the Bulldogs to strike their colors; and the exceptional smoothness of play, smashing aggressiveness and able teamwork have distinguished Baker's work throughout the season should be a deciding factor in the attack on the blue and white.

## Billy Evans Says:

### PAIR TEST.

What constitutes a fair test of the relative merits of two football teams?

Does the final result always prove the better team? Because it is college precedent, should football games always be played, regardless of the weather or the condition of the field?

Recently I made the mere suggestion that it might be a good idea to postpone football games, as are other sporting events, when conditions overhead and underfoot, tended to make a farce out of the proceedings.

In making such a suggestion I had in mind the games played on Nov. 7. That was the day Northwestern beat Michigan.

My story was that Michigan has a better team than Northwestern despite the 3-2 defeat and I stick to it.

### SLAP ON WRIST.

However, I have been taken to task by a Chicagoan, who I presume is a Northwestern alumnus. Here is what he says:

"I noticed your article on the postponement of football games under certain weather conditions because of your adverse comment on Northwestern's victory over Michigan.

"Now while I am willing to concede that you are one of the six best umpires in baseball, I am willing to concede also that Glen Thistlewaite is a little better football coach than you are an umpire.

"He has said all season that Northwestern is a good team. Those who have seen it agree with him. He has maintained all along that all the team needed to find itself was a moral victory.

"Michigan came to Chicago with a spirit of 'Oh, hum, let's get that over with,' and they found a team that could have trimmed them on a dry field, a wet field, or a field covered with peak ice, and they got trimmed."

Before continuing with the episode of the Northwestern game, I must say that I have the right to carry to a board of arbitration the statement that Thistlewaite is a better coach than I am an umpire.

### PICKING TEAM TOO BIG A JOB

CHICAGO (SP) — Picking 11. Yost, for 25 years football coach at the University of Michigan, is of the opinion that selection of an all-American football team is too much of a job to be undertaken by any individual or any group of football experts.

Yost said that no matter what his opinion is, there will be no fewer than 1000 all-American teams chosen.

"As Walter Camp has stated to me more than once, during the last five years of his life, this job of selecting an all-American was growing more and more difficult because of the great number of good football men in America," Yost said.

"I feel that there can be no plan

of selecting an all-American that would do justice to all the boys in all sections of the United States today.

"I think it will be all right to attempt to select an all-conference team, or perhaps an all-eastern team, or an all-pacific coast team for a single man or a group of men in those sections have had some chance of seeing and knowing the abilities of the football men included or covered in their selections."

### Rayon Fabric Popular Despite Silk Sales

NEW YORK (AP) — The silk worm, after losing its secret, is giving way to the competition of man's science and machinery.

Rayon, an artificial textile fabric closely resembling silk in appearance, is used in the manufacture of the domestic production, and of ribbon, cotton and woolen goods. Its tensile strength is greater than cotton and less than silk.

Count Hilaire de Chardonnet was the first to produce rayon and he called it artificial silk when he introduced the fabric at the Paris exposition in 1884. His invention resulted from a study of the organic process which takes place as the silk worm produces silk.

threads which are pumped into chemical baths to harden and bleach them. From this stage, the fibres are spun and handled like silk.

The silk fibroin which rayon imparts to cotton fabric when woven into it within the past few months has resulted in a large demand from the cotton mills of the south and has greatly stimulated the sale of cotton goods throughout the country.

### DEATH SENTENCE UPHOLD

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — The state supreme court Monday upheld the first degree conviction of William Cavalier, the 15-year-old boy sentenced to death by the Schuylkill county court for the killing of his grandmother.

Cavalier is believed to be the youngest boy ever sentenced to death by a Pennsylvania court. His grandmother, Mrs. Catherine Cavalier of Mechanicsville, near Philadelphia, was 88 years old. Cavalier admitted he killed her for the purpose of robbery. More than \$100 in cash taken from Mrs. Cavalier was found in the boy's possession.

Cavalier had been cared for by his grandparents ever since he was eight months old, when his father and mother separated.
