In all the world there is no industry of such primal importance as that of making men and women. Joseph A. Leighton, in his "Epoch of Philosophy" says: "The history of human progress is chiefly the story of the creative beginnings made by great individuals in all directions. Knowledge, discovery, invention, industry, politics, education, art, and even religion are modified, reconstructed, revived, re-propelled by the creative, exploring, organizing individuals."  
If this is true, then every human being has the right to that training that will enable him to contribute his share to the progress of mankind. There are conditions of life that deprive girls, especially, of this right, thereby taking to the world many otherwise effective lives.  
The great Confucius said, "I am not concerned that I have no place, I am concerned how I may fit myself for one."  
Not only is this fitting of one's self for her place the primal consideration in every girl's life, but it should be the primal consideration of every club woman's life to see that every girl is given this opportunity to fit herself for her place.

Realizing the importance of proper training for the individual, and that many otherwise effective lives were being lost through lack of such training, a band of women at a convention in La Grande in 1918 started a fund called the Scholarship Loan fund, in order to help girls attain their aim. This fund, started with \$100, has grown to thousands of dollars. Up to date, 524 girls have been helped toward acquiring a higher education, 12 of whom are Union and Wallawa county girls.

It has been not only the duty but the joy and privilege of the Neighborhood club to make a generous donation to this fund each year. This year, under the chairmanship of Mrs. J. T. Richardson, a most unique project has been planned. Mrs. Richardson has chosen 12 assistants, each of whom will select three other residents. These groups of four will serve a series of luncheons for a nominal sum, each group inviting 12 others. It is planned that these groups shall not only be entertained in a social way but that they may be inspired with the intrinsic worth of having had a hand in the world's greatest industry, the making of men.
