Chicago Freight Yards Move More Than 9,000 Cars Daily

CHICAGO (AP)—If all the freight cars loaded at Chicago hub of many railroads, in one day of this record-breaking season were made up in a single train, borders of timing motorists would have to wait maddeningly at grade crossings until some 5,000 freight cars had rumbled past. The actual condition is hardly less spectacular and vastly more complex.

Some 2,500 cars, sorted and shunted about the switching district and coupled with hundreds from other destinations, are then sent to all points of the compass on a network of tracks. Some of them are loaded in the yards or at the shipper; others at widely distributed freight stations, and they must be separated, according to destination, in the railroad yards.

At the clearing railroad yards, thousands of these cars are pushed over a "hump," or elevated portion of track. Then by their own weight and momentum they roll down this artificial hill and are switched to the particular track in this labyrinth of rails to join other cars bound for the same general direction or road.

French Humor Still Holds Sway in Paris Latin Quarter

PARIS. (AP)—Stars may come and go and obscurity in so far as tourists are concerned may continue, but the gay Latin Quarter cabarets remain the same as of old.

All the glitter and splendor of the Folies-Bergere and other great music halls, which are filled with Americans anxious to see Paris at its full height of naughtiness, are missing in the Latin Quarter shows.

But what they lack in the way of slightly clad dancers, the cabarets make up in the suggestiveness of lines in many of the songs and monologues. The humor, however, is lost on listeners with only a thorough knowledge of French and it is for this reason that tourists seldom find their way here.

Resembling somewhat the Frying Pan in Moscow which produced Baffert and the Chauve Souris, later famous in New York and London, the Latin Quarter cabarets exhibit many pictures of former artists that many graduated to the great theatres.
