**GIRLS TARDY,
ABSENT LESS**

Do girls care their reputation for high scholastic standards by attending school with more regularity than do the boys?

K. D. Towler, principal of the La Grande high school, says there is a well established connection between high grades and regular attendance. The records for the

month just show that nearly 50 per cent of the girls achieved perfect attendance records, while only a little more than 42 per cent of the boys were in school every day without absence of tardiness.

Out of a total enrollment of 451 students, 296 were neither absent nor tardy for the month of November—a percentage of 45.3 which is considered unusually high for high school students.

Eighty-six of the 292 boys and 129 of the 249 girls made perfect scores on attendance.

Freshmen in school this year are numbered at 134. Sophomores rank next with 99; then seniors with 87, and juniors with 76. Five students

are enrolled as unclassified.

**AMBASSADORS
MUST SPEND**

The average man probably will say \$15,000 is a pretty good yearly income. An income's sufficiency, however, depends on how its recipient has to live. "Has" to live? Can't he live to suit himself? Not always. An ambassador, among others, has got to live up to his job. "Got" is the word. His style of living is a matter concerning which a diplomat has no choice.

That's why the United States diplomatic service is a service for rich men exclusively. This isn't necessarily true of the consular service. A consul hasn't a plenipotentiary's social obligations. It isn't true of foreign diplomats in America. Most of them draw two, three or four times the pay ours do. Our ministers at a very few modest capitals do manage to live on their salaries. But generally speaking it spells ruin for a man without large financial resources of his own to accept a foreign post under our government.

The ambassador, or minister, isn't the only one whose official income won't support him. His whole staff of secretaries and attendants are in the same fix. Their expenses aren't as high as their salaries, but neither are their salaries.
