**"The Ancient Highway"**  
New Willat Production Showing at Star

Oregon climate, Oregon scenery and Oregon in general, from her snow-capped peaks to her green carpet of dense forests and her ribbon-pattern of multitudinous streams, contributed, in a great measure, to the making of the Paramount picture, "The Ancient Highway," which comes to the Star theatre Friday for a three day run.

For the early scenes of the James Oliver Curwood story Irvin Willat, the director, headed a company of more than a hundred players into Oregon, the personnel including Jack Holt, Billie Dove and Montagu Love, the featured players.

The objective of the company was the second splash dam of the middle fork of the Coquille River, approximately 20 miles from Coquille, Oregon and in the heart of the log country.

One of the big sequences in the picture shows timbermen felling 150 foot trees, a wonderful sight and with plenty of action.

Four cameras filmed the scenes, each cameraman in imminent danger at all times in the event of one of the big trees falling. Willat directed the entire sequence from a log boom in the river. At one time he lost balance and only quick work saved him from drowning.

Other thrilling scenes were filmed at what is known as splash dam No. 3, of the middle fork of the Coquille River, at which point the dam opens and the log drive is at its height.

At this point Willat stretched the cameras out for a quarter of a mile and operated one camera himself, using a special telescopic lens. Once this dam is opened the water rushed through with such tremendous force that a boat is tossed about like a chip.

Despite the many handicaps and the dangers, Willat completed the scenes he was after and they are claimed to be among the most thrill filled the screen has ever seen.

This could be accomplished through intelligent use of fertilizer and better varieties of seed, said Professor M. J. Pritchett, director of the station, in a report on the results of studies extending over a fifteen year period.

The added cost necessary to increase production would be small compared with the net return and it would not be necessary to extend the cotton area, he explained.
