The village gossip begins working overtime. Mary is warned and Jim in an effort to protect her honor engages in a fist fight with a shopkeeper and is thrown into a cell in the local jail.

Things look dark for him, but Mary comes to his rescue and promises the court that they have been engaged and are to be married soon. Jim is freed, still loyal to the buddy over there, believes that Mary's heart is with him in Flanders fields.

And then the aftermath of war brings about one of its strange circumstances. Bill, wounded and gassed, had been taken prisoner by the Germans. Now he comes marching home to see Mary—to find out if Jim had returned and kept his promise.

In a highly dramatic situation the three meet. And there you will find what Drusilla meant about "buddy"—what the word buddy connotes, what it meant to the men under fire, what it meant in life to those who had stood together in the great shadow of death.

Excellent comedy relief is furnished by the warring townsmen of the villagers who have set up their own hard and fast code of ethics.

**SALEM, Ore.**—The public service commission has handed down orders apportioning the cost of constructing an undergrade crossing involving the tracks of the Southern Pacific near Lakeside, Coos county, and an overhead crossing involving the tracks of the Central Pacific company near Klamath Falls.

For the payment of \$20,000 in connection with the undergrade crossing near Lakeside the Southern Pacific was assessed 40 per cent of the total, state highway commission 20 per cent and Coos county 30 per cent.
