NEW FIELD.
 Football is beginning to have something in common with a major league baseball franchise. This goes for the college and professional brand.

First, the ball magnates made use of their stadiums in promoting outdoor lights. These during in much additional revenue brought the summer months.

Football now gives every promise of being far more profitable to major league club owners than outdoor boxing.

There is little or no expense connected with college football. With boxing it is different, the headliners get most of the receipts.

BIG BUSINESS.
 Once upon a time a baseball magnate had only 77 days to realize on his investment, that being the number of at home games. It's different now.

While attending the Army-Navy game I had a long chat with Ed Burrows, business manager of the New York Americans. He is hopeful of landing the West Point, Annapolis game for next year.

The biggest game staged at the Yankee stadium this fall was the clash between the Army and Notre Dame. Close to 75,000 attended and the receipts were in the neighborhood of \$250,000.

Callen Center.
 In Callen at center we have a true example of a man with a football heart and a determination to play the game for sixty minutes. On defense he was a real power and was the mainstay in stopping line backs. He was also good at intercepting forward passes, being able to diagnose most plays which is a strong trait of any football player.

Flint, of Union, at right guard I am shifting him from tackle position where he played to that of center. I have watched Flint the past two years and I know of no one who has developed more than he has done. He plays football all the time, has great power on offense, being able to open holes and he is also a hard man to handle on defense. I predict a good future for him in college football.

Adrian, of Baker, at right tackle, is another man who plays an excellent brand of football. Adrian has real power on defense and has the build and is the type of a real tackle. He will bear watching next year.

At right end I am placing Tom Duff who has a very uncanny knack of handling forward passes, is fast going down on punts and is a strong defensive end.

Hutton Captain.
 I am placing Hutton at quarterback although he played fullback most of the year. Hutton is a real football player in that he plays football all the time while in the game. He is one of the best kickers and passers in Eastern Oregon and he is a line plunger as well. I am also giving him the honor of captain because of his display of headwork.

At left half I placed Hines, of Baker. Hines is a very good broken field runner and as a forward passer, I have never seen his equal in high school football. He is good on defense but the reason I consider Duff better than Hines is the fact that Hines does not run interference the way he should be unequalled by any football player in Eastern Oregon.

In Coe, of Union, we have one of the best line plungers that we have had in Eastern Oregon for some time. Very seldom is it that he fails to gain yardage and he also is a very good defensive man. He will be a hard man to stop next year if he keeps up in proportion to his showing this year.

Second Team Selections.
 Zundel, La Grande, plays it hard game at all times, is good at receiving forward passes and carries the ball well when called for end around plays. Hughson La Grande, had he been in physical condition this season would have been placed on the first team but because of injuries in an accident at the start of the season he was unable to hit his stride. Left guard Siverson, of Imbler, showed up well, being a particularly strong defensive man.

Center, York, of Baker, was a good passer and a good defensive player. Right guard, Smith, of La Grande, exceptionally good at finishing through and smearing plays behind the opponents' scrimmage line. I predict a good year for him next fall.

Right tackle, Strand, of La Grande, did not hit his stride until late in the season but should develop into a good college football player. Taylor, of Union, at right end had been able to speed forward passes and play offense as he did defense he would have been placed on the first team. He is an exceptionally good end.

Glass, at quarter, was one of the mainstays of the La Grande back-

field, was a handy football player, a good drop kicker and good forward passer. I give him the honor as captain.

Back, left fullback, was a real contender for the first team. He is an excellent man at handling punts and was unquashed by anyone in Eastern Oregon in this particular field. Had he played with a stronger team he would have shown to much better advantage.

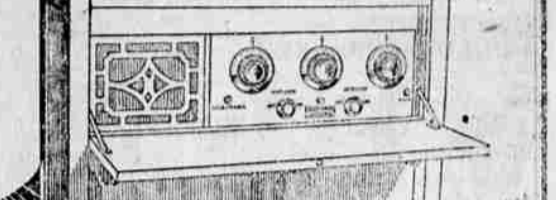
