## Leads Navy BIG MUNN TO TURN TO RING



CHICAGO (AP)—Big Munn, the Nebraska heavyweight, who for a time last winter held the wrestling championship, plans to return to the boxing game, and will meet Andre Anderson at Kansas City soon. It was announced Wednesday by Munn's new manager, Ed White of Chicago.

Munn took to wrestling about two years ago after three appearances with gloves had left him on the losing end. In one of his first matches as a wrestler, he threw Strangler Lewis out of the ring at Kansas City and so injured him that Munn won a second fall and the world's championship in a few minutes.

In their return match, Lewis was easily victorious. Claiming a foul Lewis had refused to give up the diamond-studded belt after the Kansas City match, but it was at stake in the second contest at Michigan City.

To complicate the title situation, Stanislaus Zyzsko tossed Munn for a defeat in Philadelphia while Munn was still claiming the title. Lewis apparently ignored this loss in Munn's title claims, and reclaimed the title of the world's champion when he defeated Munn.

John Western Trust.

The elder Zyzsko belonged to the eastern wrestling trust and after his victory over Munn, the eastern stable of wrestlers killed their interests in contests for the world's heavyweight championship. Munn joined the western trust based upon Chicago, and when he started his country-wide tour after the Kansas City victory, agreed not to bill himself as the champion in a California match. He was victorious until he took on Zyzsko at Philadelphia while out of condition and sick with a heavy cold.

The argument between the eastern and western trusts over that Zyzsko victory and the title never has been cleared away. As soon as the winter wrestling season opened, Munn resumed wrestling and has had several matches already this winter against Toots Mondt and others of the western wrestling trust.

When Ed White of Chicago bought Munn's contract from Chas. Kaufmann, White decided to turn the big Nebraskaan into a boxer. His new pilot intimates that no wrestling offers will be turned down, but in the future it will be boxing matches which will have first call.

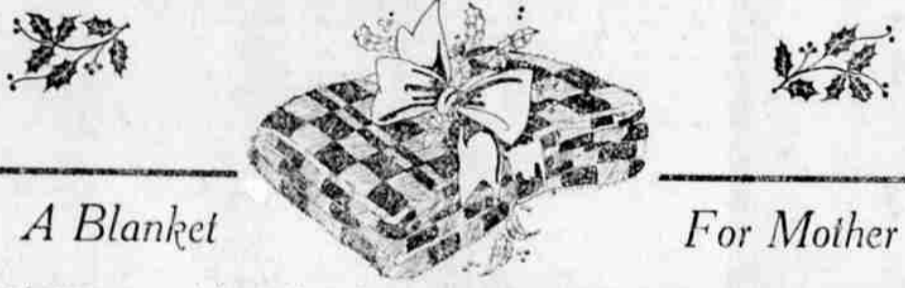

Idleman was at one time commander of Pendleton post of the American Legion and after the election of Warren G. Harding as president, Idleman became an active candidate for the position as commander of the Pendleton post office. He failed to secure the appointment as postmaster and then went into the federal bank examining department. The following is from the San Francisco Chronicle:

Perry Lester Idleman, former federal bank auditor and now an auditor for the Matson Navigation company failed to keep apart two women, each of whom claims to be his wife.

As a result Idleman was arrested yesterday on a charge of bigamy just as he was about to board a ship here for the Hawaiian Islands. The charge was preferred in San Jose and Idleman is in custody there, being held under \$2000

bonds.

Mrs. Idleman No. 2, as she terms herself, is the man's accused. She is 28 year old and resides at the Manx hotel here. Before her marriage to Idleman in San Jose last February her name was Ruth Agnew Warner.

Early this month she unfolded her story to the San Jose authorities and Deputy District Attorney Chester Moore of that city decided, after an investigation, that a warrant was justified.

When they were married Idleman, 33 years old, represented himself as single, and she suspected nothing until she uncovered some of his deceptions, she said.

Wife No. 2 Sues.

"The ether wife urged that I get an annulment," Mrs. Warner Idleman told the authorities. "I was so grieved over my plight that I decided instead to prosecute."

In a statement purporting to have been given Deputy Sheriff Floyd Hopping as he was being transported to San Jose, Idleman admitted the marriage.
