MAT MATCH IS SOUGHT

CHICAGO (AP)—An offer of a \$20,000 purse for a match between Joe Stecher, the scissors king among the heavyweight wrestlers, and Jim London, heavyweight, was announced Tuesday by Joe Coffey. The match is planned for January 1 at the Chicago coliseum.

Stecher defeated Stanislaus Zbyszko for the heavyweight wrestling title last winter, soon after Zbyszko won the crown from "Big" Munn. While on a tour preliminary to a return match with Strangler Lewis, Munn took on Zbyszko at Philadelphia and was quickly flopped. That gave the eastern wrestling circuit the edge on the title, which they have since retained.

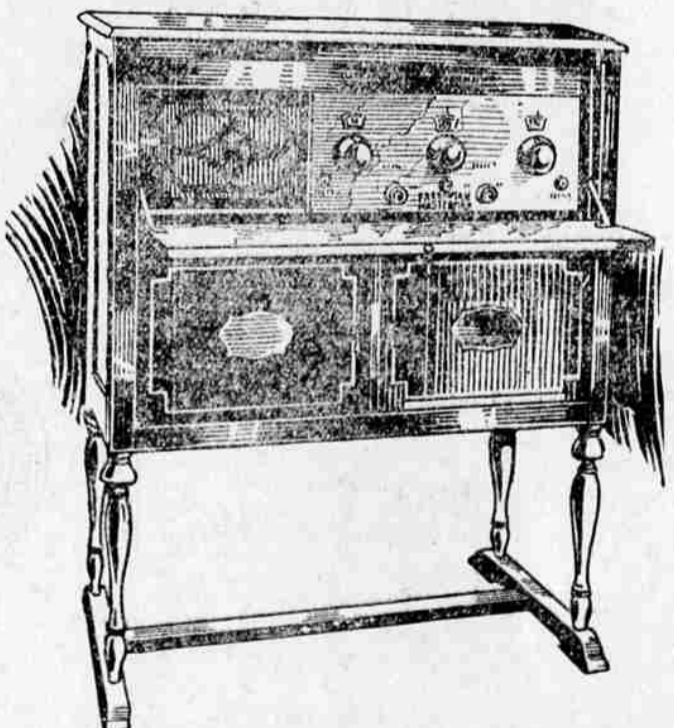
