"Clothes Make the Pirate" Is Big Laugh of Week

Pirates are more to be laughed at than feared. If you are inclined to dispute that, just drop in to the Arcade theater either Wednesday or Thursday and laugh yourself into accord. For there you will see the irresistibly funny Leon Errol and Dorothy Gish in a pirate comedy, "Clothes Make the Pirate," that is glistening with delightful humor and satire.

Errol, who was very funny, as fans will remember, in "Sally," is doubly laughable in "Clothes Make the Pirate," which Sam E. Rokk has produced for First National release. For in this appearance Errol is the star with Dorothy Gish and has full reign for his inimitable antics.
