WOMAN GOES TO PRISON.
OREGON CITY, Ore.—A woman voluntarily went to jail here because her husband violated his parole. Mrs. H. C. Graham, scarcely more than a girl, and pretty, walked into the sheriff's office and gave herself up when she learned the officers were looking

for her and that her father wished to recall the \$500 bail he had deposited to gain her freedom. She is charged with possession and transportation of liquor and the operation of a still.
 Mrs. Graham, her husband and H. E. Bonifant, arrested early in the fall in the mountains south of Molalla, were brought to the county jail here. After being indicted by the grand jury Graham pleaded guilty with the understanding that his wife was to be released. He was sentenced to six months in the county jail and a fine of \$250. A few weeks ago deputies learned it is said, that Graham and another paroled man had been preparing to set up another still at Ladd hill. Graham escaped and was last seen at Astoria. When he violated his parole he automatically returned the chains against his wife.

CRIME TRICKS INVESTIGATED

NEW YORK (By the Associated Press)—In a New York laboratory, there are men continually working and studying to keep up with the tricks, old and new, of professional burglars.

These experts crack supposedly burglar-proof safety vaults, solve the mystery of electric alarm systems designed to protect buildings from thieves and open locks reputed to be unopenable without the right keys—all to beat the burglar at his own game.
 When a national epidemic of burglaries became serious, it resulted in insurance companies and manufacturers authorizing the Government's Laboratory to organize the writing of standards of various means of protection and then to test devices to see if they measured up to the provisions.

Since efficient burglars had learned how to get around or through most appliances then being used, it became necessary to evolve others. "Inefficient" burglars who could be trusted were employed to see whether the devices would give the necessary protection.

One of the methods is to attempt to muffle the alarm gong or to put it out of commission. The apparatus is set up. The expert begins to work guiltily, skillfully and quickly. Suddenly the gong rattles the alarm. An observer remarks that fifty seconds passed before the attack was discovered and given away by the alarm.
 A second attack is tried, but just as it appears the expert is about to succeed the gong clangs again. "Foolish! Not yet," for the "burglar" tries a third and successful

method. A confidential report containing suggestions for strengthening the device then is sent to the manufacturing company.
 An invention designed to protect jewelers from thieves who crash display windows, grab jewels and other valuables and escape before officers arrive, is tested. It consists of a heavy steel shutter which falls the moment the glass is cracked, often catching the entering arm.
 The expert breaks one glass after another, testing the device. Each time the shutter falls with a resounding crash. Every known method of making the invention fail of its purpose is tried and by the time the experts have finished nothing is left of the thing. If it has met the standard requirements approval is given. If it fails, or improvements can be made, the manufacturers are advised.

So on through the days and sometimes at night goes the work of safe-cracking, store-breaking and other burglaries. The experts refer to each other frequently as the "Omaha Kid," "Red Hogan" and other like names, but they have become known as the safest and most beneficial burglars in business.

SAWMILL BEING BUILT
NEWPORT, Ore.—Contractors have begun placing material with which to finish the extension of the sawmill paralleling Front street, as well as grading and graveling the street the entire length. The sawmill is an expensive piece of concrete work that will insure property owners against the high tides that have served to destroy waterfront property for the last 40 years. The street is being prepared for paving and when completed, Newport will boast of having six miles of macadam streets, and four miles of concrete sidewalks.

Newport has improved her streets at less cost than costs small towns, due in part to the city owning its own rock quarry, and letting its contracts in large amounts. The entire city seems to be forging ahead under new impulses.

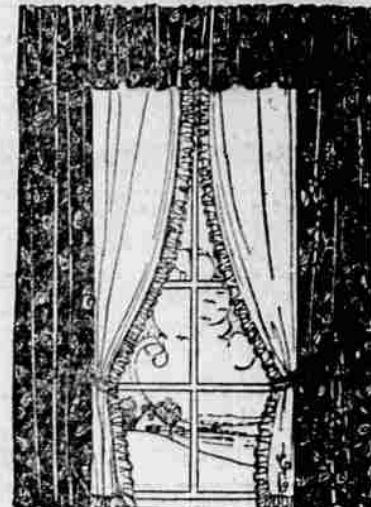
