Stanley Dollar Buys Vernon Baseball Club

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The Vernon baseball club of the Pacific Coast league changed hands in one of the biggest deals consummated in coast baseball circles in years when Stanley Dollar, San Francisco shipping man, purchased the franchise from E. H. Maser at a price reported to be between \$200,000 and \$225,000. William H. McCarthy, former president of the league, will become president of the new club which is to be known as the "Mission Baseball club."

Negotiations were carried out by Herbert Fleischacker, San Francisco banker, acting for Dollar. Purchase of the club will give San Francisco continuous baseball. George A. Johnson, secretary and part owner of the San Francisco baseball club, is quoted as saying that neither he nor his associates would place any obstacles in the way of the new team. The owners of the present playing team will rent their new park to the Mission club.

BOXERS UNDER SUSPENSION

HOLLYWOOD, Cal. (AP)—Sally Montgomery, former Centre college football player, and Terry McHugh, New York featherweight boxer, are under 30-day suspensions and their purses held up for fouling last Wednesday night in bouts on a Los Angeles fight card. Montgomery fouled George Godfrey, negro heavyweight, and Rafe Canton, Filipino, was hit low by McHugh.

In addition, Seth W. P. Strelinger, chairman of the state athletic commission, intimated that an example might be made of Montgomery for his alleged foul tactics. Strelinger said the matter will be brought up at the commission meeting next week at Sacramento.

CALIFORNIA FIGHT FANS SPEND \$2,500,000 IN 1924

SACRAMENTO, Cal. (AP)—Fight fans of California spent approximately \$2,500,000 for the pleasure of watching boxing bouts during 1925, figures made public Friday by the state athletic commission reveal, and of this total the commission's share was \$446,765.

The total attendance of all clubs was 1,605,564 including those staging wrestling cards. Wrestling, however, Secretary Walter Yarwood of the commission, explained, cost such a small figure in attendance in gate receipts totals that it need not be considered.

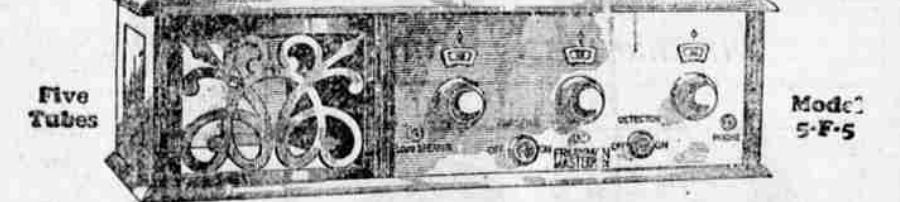
