### Rubber of Domestic Source Is Manufactured in Texas

MARATHON, Tex., (AP)—In the little southeast Texas town domestic rubber is manufactured from the guayule plant, which grows wild all over this section. A factory under the spur of high rubber prices, has reached an output of a ton a day. The guayule is a shrub, three to five feet high, and resembles sagebrush. Beneath its outer bark is a sap, known as latex, from which the rubber is made. The shrub is put up in bales, like hay, and the sap pressed out in a machine called a mangle mill. About 20,000 gallons of water, supplied by wells, is required to produce a ton of rubber. The plant is gathered, root and all, and brings about \$40 a ton at the factory here. The finished product comes from the presses in sheets about three inches thick, 30 inches long, and 15 inches wide.
