Clackamas Tax Receipts Higher.
 OREGON CITY, Ore.—A total of \$1,831,986.67, in taxes was collected in Clackamas county during 1925 by the tax department of the office of Sheriff Mass, an annual report just completed here by David Dalmbald, chief deputy in that division, shows. All of this amount had been turned over to the treasurer's office by January 1, 1926, and since that time several thousand dollars have been paid on the 1924 taxes. During 1924 the total taxes amounted to \$1,654,764.91.

Broadway Methodist Church
 Model for Western Building NEW YORK, (AP)—The middle-west is coming to Broadway for ideas in church building.

At least three churches in Minnesota, Ohio and Missouri are to be patterned after the new Broadway Temple, the new twenty-four story, \$4,000,000 church now being erected for the Methodist-Episcopal denomination.

Recently a committee of business men and clergy from Minneapolis came here to study the project with a view to erecting a similar church in their home town.

The idea of a religious-social structure is spreading throughout the country, according to the Rev. Christian P. Reiser, pastor of the 11th Street Methodist-Episcopal church.

The Baptist church of St. Louis is considering a project similar to the Broadway Temple, while a church group of Columbus, has commissioned Donn Barber, architect of the Broadway Temple, to design a similar building for the Ohio city.

The basement of the new edifice goes down thirty-five feet and cost \$216,000 to excavate. In this part of the church there will be a gymnasium, swimming pool, bowling alleys, pool tables and equipment for social work.

View Nebraska's Capital as Purely American Style LINCOLN, Neb., (AP)—A new school of architecture, distinctly American in its appropriateness to the western prairie is seen in Nebraska's new \$9,900,000 capitol by Prof. Hartley R. Alexander, of the University of Nebraska.

"The Nebraska capitol marks a new style," he said. "It is an American style—a prairie style. The capitol re-echoes the symbolism of the prairie soil and such symbolism no other edifice in the United States can match. It is a style which newer generations of architects will surely develop."

The building, when completed, will be in the form of a square surrounded by a perpendicular tower 400 feet in height.
