 HOLLISTER, Idaho—Stockholders of the Salmon River Canal company, at an annual meeting here Monday, re-elected Nelson Hayward and A. J. Lindemer for three-year terms as directors, and elected as a new member of the board J. H. Stensrud Sr., to succeed Robert Boyd, who had let it be understood that he was not a candidate for reelection. Out of a total of 60,000 shares, 53,000 were represented at the meeting.

The stockholders voted approval of an amendment to the bylaws, proposed by Nelson Hayward, to provide that Twin Falls instead of Milner should be the alternative place of meeting, the principal place of business continuing in Hollister.

**Sugar Beet Industry Grows**  
 LAKYVIEW, Ore.—Sugar beets grown by Smith Brothers in the Yernon district last season totaled 12.4 sugar, with 86.3 per cent purity, according to a report obtained recently furnished by the Amalgamated Sugar company by County Agent Porter.

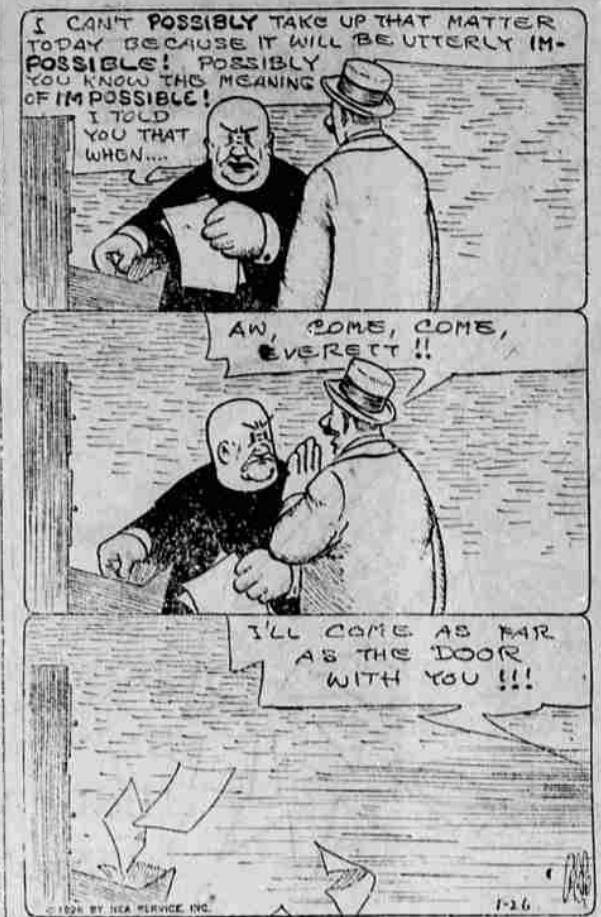
Smith Brothers grew three and one-half acres of beets from which they reported a total yield of approximately 70 tons, or 29 tons per acre. Considering that the average sugar content for California beets is 14.3 per cent, that of the Smith beets is very good.

This report suggests just another agricultural possibility for the Goose lake valley, for there are several thousand acres here which are suitable for the culture of sugar beets and which will doubtless attract the attention of sugar companies when more adequate transportation facilities have been provided.

The movement for a sugar factory is already under way in Klamath county, where this last season 500 acres of beets were grown and shipped out. The experience of last season convinced the Klamath growers that beets are a desirable crop for them to grow. Seventy-five carloads were produced there last year, the average test being about 15 per cent sugar and the average yield, with good care, 12 to 16 tons per acre.

**Yorkshire Pudding**  
 Two eggs, 1 cup milk, 1 cup flour, 2 teaspoon salt, beef drippings from roast.

Mix and sift flour and salt and put into mixing bowl. Make a well in the center of the flour and add the egg, unbeat. Stir, gradually mixing in the flour from the sides. Add the milk a little at a time, beating to keep smooth. When about half the milk is used and a thick smooth batter is formed, beat well for ten minutes. Heat in the rest of the milk. Cover and
