Later in the season come the sheep, who acquire every speck of grass in their pathway and make the land non-productive for years to come, "sloped" into the ground.

STRIKES TO BE USED
SALEM, Ore., Convicts in the Oregon state penitentiary who fail to yield to discipline, either through incorperation in the "bull pen" or stimulation of prison privileges, will be compelled to wear uniforms of striped materials, according to an ultimatum issued here by J. W. White, warden of the institution.

Warden Little said that thus far less than a dozen prisoners had been compelled to don the stripes, which were abandoned by several in order to the Oregon Institution many years ago.

In another order to be posted within the next few days wages paid to convicts employed in the state this plant probably will be reduced 50 per cent. Most of these convicts are now being paid 50 cents a day for their labor.

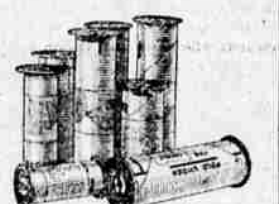
