Farm Pointers

Time has proven effective in restoring the structure and improving the condition of drained white land at the Oregon experiment station.

Applying sulfur on Oregon alfalfa land some time in advance of the growing season and harrowing it under when the meadow is renovated has proven the best practice at the experiment station. This will aid in the oxidation of the sulfur into the sulfate or a similarly effective form.

Successful growers of farm sheep in Oregon dock all lambs and castrate all buck lambs that are to be marketed. Explains the college extension service, buck lambs marketed with long tails are discriminated against at the stock yards, because the meat from such lambs is stringy and unpalatable. The weight of a buck lamb comes over the front quarters with a very noted deficiency in the rear quarters.

Docking and castrating lambs are best done when the lamb is a week or ten days old, says the Oregon extension service. Experiments have shown that a sharp knife is the best instrument for both operations. In docking, the wound heals more readily when made by a knife than with a hot iron. Lambs that have been castrated before the operations are castrated to bleed more, because of increased heart action. A warm sunny day for the operations is recommended.

Blossom blight of cherries and peaches is controlled in Oregon by spraying with Bordeaux 4-6-50 with spreader just before the blossoms open, says the experiment station. Prune and sprout growers in Douglas and Wasco counties who suffer seriously from blossom blight are warranted in applying a second spray in mid bloom followed by a third as the petals fall, for this gives good results.

Hot formaldehyde treatment of seed potatoes used by Oregon growers is recommended by M. R. McKay, pathologist of the experiment station, to take the place of the cold formaldehyde dips. One pint in 15 gallons of water at 124-125 degrees Fahrenheit in which the tubers are held for 2-4 minutes is the formula used.
