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'CHINA DOLL' WINS PRAISE

(A REVIEW)
A glorious contemplation of brilliant effects, each scene nearly a work of art in itself, with Barbara Hagen alternately strutting her stuff and captivating her audience with a winsome interpretation of an unsophisticated girl brought up in Chinese surroundings and believing herself oriental, featured the presentation of "My China Doll" at the Arcade last night.

Barbara, versatile and capable and with a pathetic appeal at times that bored straight into the heart of every spectator, could hardly have been better cast. From her characterization of the Chinese maiden through the jazy conceptions and the final blossoming out as an American girl, her part was handled with the same things that a French pastry king employs in a dazzling, intriguing cake.

From the opening scene until the final curtain, the audience found much to delight in. Clever dancing, harmonious singing, well chosen costumes and colorful, rich stage settings made up an interesting whole—an extravaganza such as has not been seen in local theaters before.

To the writer, the part that stood out above all others was a trio "How I Love The Flowers," masterfully rendered by Barbara, William P. Murphy, and Jessie Delmore. A drenched stage with a rose tree casting a soft, shimmering glow proved a perfect background.

"My China Doll" had a variety of good points. Comedy, some pathos, and doubt until the third was cut from the race's side, took their toll of applause. Tom Crowley, Miss Delmore, and Mr. Murphy furnished the greater share of the comedy while George Walker, who played the villain—and his mistake in the first act certainly gave future villains something to strive to match.

Leona Slater, as the puppy lady introduced Barbara into the joys and sorrows of life.

The attendance was hardly of a size that would be expected for a show of "The China Doll's" character.

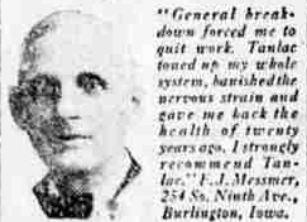
