piece of very fine Persian work,

worth a large amount of money.

Shows Considerable Growth

TOKYO (AP)—Rice consumption

in Japan in 1925 is estimated by the

agriculture and forestry depart-

ment at 335,000,000 bushels. Of

this total, 235,000,000 were of do-

mestic production, while the re-

mainder was imported principally

from Korea, China and Indo-China.

Compared with the preceding year

an increased consumption of 6,150,-

000 bushels is shown.
