A REVISED SPEED LIMIT.

In Wisconsin a new law increases the speed limit to 40 miles an hour on paved highways and creates a minimum speed of 20 miles an hour at the same time. In other words, a motorist is considered just as dangerous to fellow travelers if he moves less than a 20-mile rate as he is if he goes beyond the 40-mile limit. One can cause accidents as well as the other.

The whole story of traffic and speed regulation is, as it has always been, one of careful driving as opposed to that variety which takes chances. Many drivers can proceed at a speed of 40 or 50 miles an hour on a straight stretch of good road and be less dangerous to others on the highway than he who drives at 30 and cuts in on curves, is careless about passing other cars, and fails to watch the road. Most accidents are the result of carelessness and chance-taking rather than speed.

Here in Oregon the present speed limit of 30 miles an hour is ideal for many of our highways. It is observed on many stretches, not because of the existence of the law but because the nature of the highway demands it. There are other roads, paved and macadam, that permit a safe speed much in excess of the present limit. And that higher speed is maintained very frequently by many drivers who are otherwise law-abiding citizens. Oregon can well stand a new speed law with the limit raised and more severe penalties provided for the careless, reckless variety of driver.

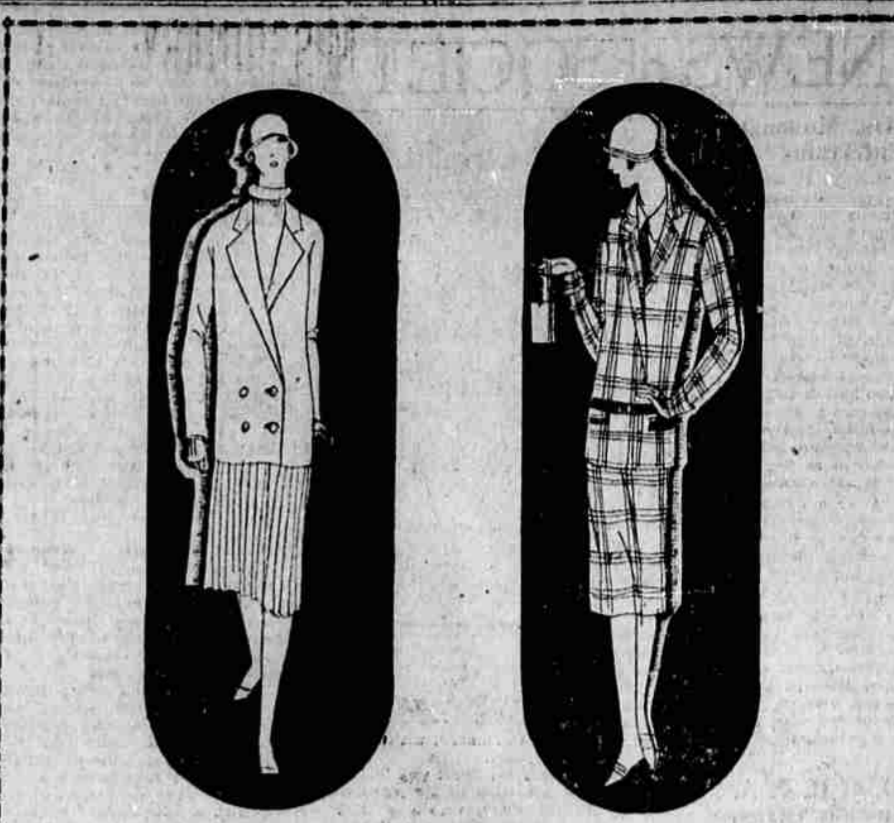
