ENDING THE MINE STRIKE.

In the general rejoicing over the ending of the anthracite miners' strike, scant attention will be accorded the terms of the agreements to which the United Mine Workers and the operators have subscribed. The people to whom anthracite is the preferred if not the absolutely essential fuel will not long remember the inconvenience to which they have been subjected once they have an uninterrupted supply of their favorite coal.

With the long period of hardship and suffering behind them the miners will be delighted to work hard that they may recover with least possible delay something of what they have lost since quitting the mines on September 1; they will not be disposed to hold futile "post mortems" on the strike. The operators are in much the same case as the miners. The five-and-a-half months' suspension is water under the bridge.

As for the portion of the American public not directly interested in anthracite, its detached position will enable it to form accurate, but so far as material or moral effect is concerned, wholly academic conclusions. Chief of these is that the strike, utterly futile in yielding the advantages for which it was begun, was indefensible and wantonly prolonged. Apparently this agreement, if honestly adhered to, will avoid strikes for approximately five years. If it does that it should be possible to carry on anthracite production without strikes for all time in the future.
