Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary) Breakfast—Stewed prunes, cereal, thin cream, crisp whole wheat toast, creamed eggs on toast, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Macaroni with beef, brown bread, sliced oranges with grated coconut, milk, tea.

Dinner—Pork chops and apples on sauerkraut, scalloped potatoes, buttered cauliflower, pear and cream cheese salad, stonage cake, floating island, graham bread, milk, coffee.

When purchasing macaroni remember that a good brand is essential. While the proper cooking of this paste-food is of utmost importance a poor brand won't lend itself to "proper cooking."

Macaroni-With Beef Two slices bacon, 1/2 pound round steak, 1 large onion, 2 cups boiling water, 1 cup macaroni broken in inch pieces, 2 cups canned tomatoes, 2 teaspoons dark brown sugar, 1/2 teaspoon pepper.

Cut bacon into tiny pieces and dry out fat. Cut meat into half-inch dice and sear quickly in hot bacon fat. Stir with a fork and cook until meat is brown. Add boiling water, onion cut in thin slices, tomatoes, sugar and pepper.

cover closely. Simpler over a low fire for two hours or until the meat is tender. Put 4 cups of rapidly boiling water into a large sauce pan. Add 2 teaspoons salt and when water is boiling hard slowly add macaroni without letting the boiling stop. Boil 20 minutes or until tender, but not soft and sticky. Drain and rinse in cold water. Reheat in the meat sauce and serve at once.
