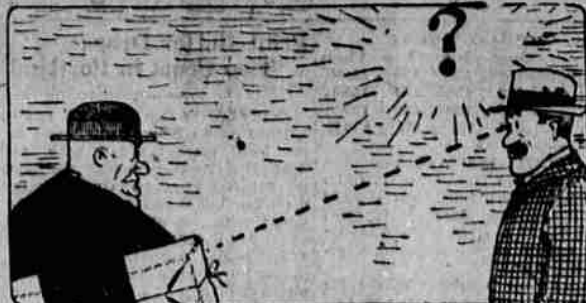
Prohibition Agents Win in Damage Action

HARTFORD, Conn., Mar. 10. (AP)—Nineteen days after the murder of William Desmond Taylor, motion picture director, in Los Angeles in 1922 a man shot himself at Watertown, Conn., a few miles above this city. Dr. Joseph A. Coogan, the medical examiner, was impressed with a similarity of the man's physical characteristics with those described in a notice sent out for apprehension of Edward Shands, Taylor's valet.

Word of the finding of the body was sent to the Los Angeles police, officials say, but no further inquiry was made by California authorities.
