ROCCO KAYOS CALGARY JIM

Stramaglia, of Portland, Finds Gorman Easy Meat; Adams Has Snap in Semi-Finals.

Stramaglia kayos Gorman in second. Adams knocks out McCoy in second. Davis and Hoffman draw. Ford and Coleman draw.

Rocco Stramaglia, 175, Portland heavyweight, found the picking to his liking here last night and, after battering Jim Gorman, 155, of Calgary, Canada, for a round and a half, put him to sleep with a right to the jaw two minutes after the second frame started.

Rocco, who brought a good reputation to La Grande, was master of the situation throughout, despite the difference in weight. Gorman delivered less than half a dozen solid blows but, on the other hand, the Portland heavy connected with opponents, body jab and about anything else he had to offer.

The first half of the opening round found Rocco taking it easy and feeling out his opponent. When he found out what Gorman had, he drove him to the ropes with a succession of rights and lefts to the face and body. The first round ended shortly afterwards, Rocco's by a mile.

Gorman floored. Rocco started the second frame off by flooring Gorman for a count of eight. As soon as the Canadian rained his feet Rocco again bored in, smashing his opponent onto the ropes which gave way. A short rest, occasioned by the necessity of repairing the ring, prolonged the end.

When the two went at it again Rocco broadcast an uppercut, a right and left in rapid succession and the big boy from the wild, open spaces took another eight. Then came the right to his jaw and curtains.

Semi-Final Disappointing. The most disappointing event on the card was the semi-final, according to fans. Buster Adams, of Boise, found an easy mark in Kid McCoy, of Pendleton, who appeared to be at least 20 pounds lighter than his Idaho opponent instead of the seven announced.

Buster, who is said to be a pretty fair scrapper, had a lot of difficulty getting his smaller opponent in a position for a blow, as the latter spent most of his time covering up—playing clam, as it were. In the second round Buster apt to him with a body blow which many thought was a trifle low. Not only did McCoy take the count but he also had to be carried from the ring to his dressing room.

Spectators expressed the opinion that had the Pendleton boy or the Boise fighter been matched against someone in either one's class, a better fight might have resulted. O. D. Scott refereed the semi-final and the main event.

Preliminaries O. K. The best bout of the evening, in point of action, interest and popular appeal, was the second preliminary, a four-round go between Kid Davis and Kid Hoffman, of La Grande. Both waded in from the opening bell and threw every kind of a blow imaginable at each other, with most taking effect. The first two rounds were furious but the two showed the pace, slowing up in the latter. Referee Farther called it a draw.

Earl Ford, and Vern Coleman fought a four-round draw in the first event. Ford, nine pounds lighter than his opponent, did most of the leading. One of the advertised four-round preliminaries, somehow or other, failed to make its appearance.

Before the main event, Tex Knight, announcer, issued a challenge to the winner on behalf of Dick Reed, heavyweight, former University of Oregon football captain, who made his debut in the ring a few nights ago by knocking out Jack Jeffries, of Portland, in the third round of a semi-final at Eugene, Ore.

The card was held at Rex hall under the auspices of the La Grande Athletic club.

E. Inlow, city school superintendent. Quinn graduated in December. Prior to that time, he spent two years in physical education at the Michigan State teachers' college. He succeeded Edward Batley who has been high school coach here for the past year. Mr. Quinn will take up his duties next year.

Roy Keene Will Coach Willamette Athletes

SALEM, Ore., Mar. 12. (AP)—Roy Keene as present freshman coach at Oregon Agricultural College will be head coach at Willamette University, beginning with the opening of the university next September.

Announcement to this effect was made yesterday following conference between President Carl Gregg Doney of the university and individual members of the board of trustees. At its next meeting the trustees will officially confirm Keene's appointment.

The selection for the coaching berth here to succeed Guy Rathbun resigned was made by the athletic board, meeting last Saturday. Since the selection by the board negotiations have been going on between President Doney, Keene and members of the board of trustees. Keene's home is in Salem.
