Order a supply of rock salt to sprinkle the asparagus bed.

Order your seeds early if you want to be sure of getting the best varieties. Often they sell out early.

To dislodge plant lice from cauliflower, brussels sprouts or kale if their presence is suspected, wash the vegetables in cold salt water before cooking. Any lice will let go and come to the surface.

Spread manure on the garden as soon as you can secure a supply. Farmers are at work at this job every warm thawing day.
