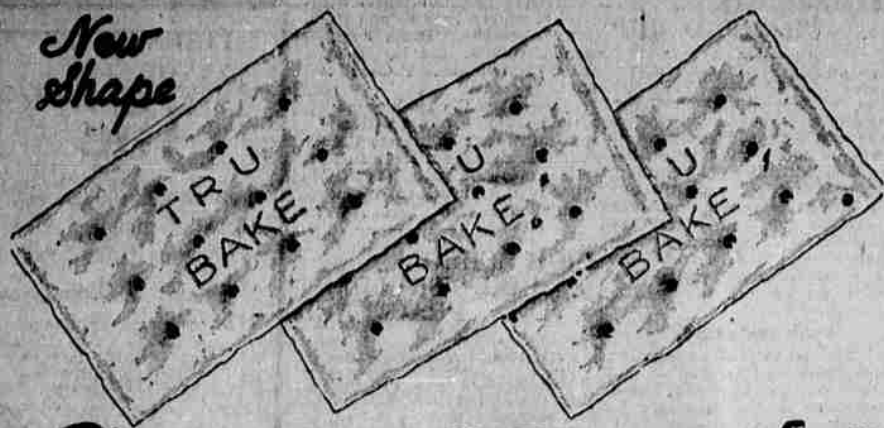

ASTORIA WINS FROM BAKER

Bulldogs Eliminated from Upper Half 20 to 18—Milton-Freewater Victorious.

SALEM, Ore., Mar. 12. (AP)—In the first day of the state high school basketball championship tournament here yesterday, Astoria eliminated Baker 20 to 18. McLaughlin downed Marshfield 24 to 22. Medford was put out of the running by Grant of Portland, 21 to 25 and Eugene anothered The Dalles 34 to 16.

The Medford-Grant contest was by far the best game of the day. The teams were evenly matched and played a fast, close checking game. Medford seemed a little over anxious and Grant won out in the last period by steady playing. At one time in the first half Medford led 12 to 6 but Grant pulled and soon tied the score.

Eugene had little difficulty in defeating The Dalles, leading in danger at no time. The Dalles had a six-foot center but was not used to advantage and Eugene's superior team work quickly swamped them.

Baker Throws Away Chance

The Astoria-Baker tilt was rather slow, and Baker lost a good chance to win by poor foul shooting.

Marshfield started out like a winner in her game with McLaughlin, scoring six points in the first minute of play but McLaughlin gradually led at the half 15 to 7. Marshfield had a two-point lead 35 seconds before the end of the game but McLaughlin sank two sensational shots and scored out 24

to 22, the winning shot being in the air as the gun fired.

Tonight Grant meets Eugene in the first contest and the winner of the Salem-Hillsboro and winner of the Astoria-McLaughlin games of this morning will play the second round tonight.

Baker Plays Today

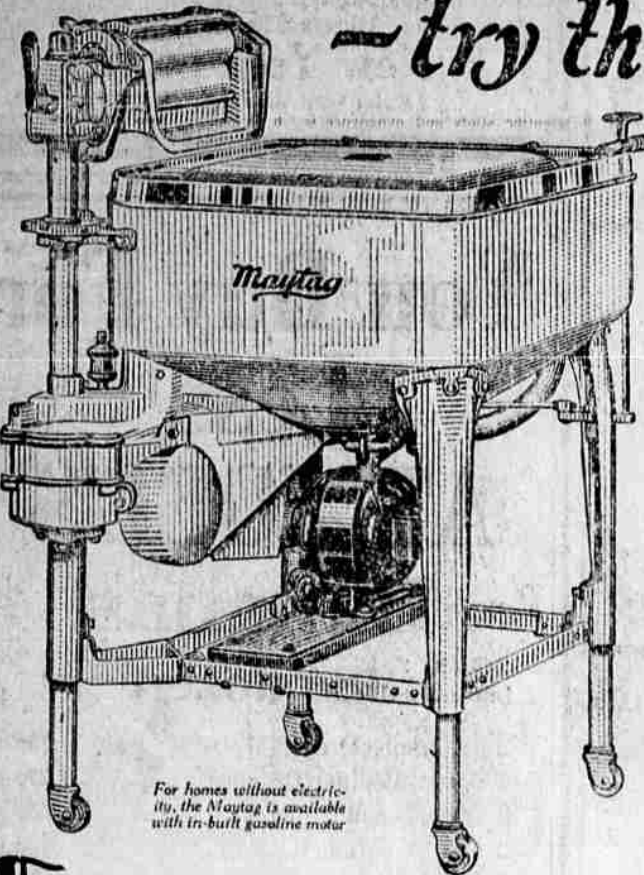
