"Cheaper to Marry" More Effective Than Ever as Picture

While holding all of the intense dramatic appeal of the stage play, the screen version of "Cheaper to Marry" now at Sherrys, is far more colorful than Samuel Shipman's original story.

This is because the motion picture takes advantage of wider latitudes, and Robert Z. Leonard, in making this picture, has brought a lavish production of society and near-society life to the screen.

In addition to an exceptional cast, Leonard brings into this film noted dancers for his café scenes, and fifty of the most beautiful bathing girls in California to the sequence devoted to showing intimate happenings in an exclusive women's athletic club. Limitations of the speaking stage made such elaborate settings impossible.

The cast includes Lewis Stone, Conrad Nagel, Paulette Goddard, Marguerite de la Motte, Louise Fazenda, Claude Gillingwater, and Richard Wayne. As the cynical Jim Knight, who does not believe in marriage, Lewis Stone adds to his fame as an actor, Paulette Goddard, as "Monsieur Boucicaut," fame, as a modern vampire, for the first time, gowned in beautiful creation and jewels. Conrad Nagel, always a capable actor, plays his role with rare accomplishment, as does Miss de la Motte seen in support of Mr. Jones and Miss Nixon, including such well-known names as Malcolm White, Fred De Silva, Luke Cosgrove, Carol Lombard and George Leachley.

"Vanishing American" Is Effective Story Of Disappearing Indian

The forced retreat into the desert wastes, marked by a trail of blood, is one of the major transgressions of the white man against the red man.

These words of Zane Grey, the novelist, who wrote "The Vanishing American," tell the crux of the story of the Indians which Paramount has made into an epic picture, and which is being presented at the Ardena theater today and Saturday.

The bitter, courageous, determined but hopeless stand of the In-

dians against the white enemies, their retreat from the green fields and well watered country they have called their home for centuries, into the barren desert is a powerful episode in "The Vanishing American."

The story was filmed in the heart of these same wastes, on the present Navajo reservation, 165 miles from a railroad.

The tale is told in the sincere, direct, dramatic manner that characterizes all of Zane Grey's works. It is not a tragedy but it does not gloss over the impositions and transgressions of the white man against the red.

The company which remained on the Navajo reservation approximately four months, included Richard Dix, who plays the role of the Indian hero, Lois Wilson, the heroine, Noah Beery, Malcolm McGregor and scores of others. The whites sent to Arizona were more than 500. Ten thousand Indians took part in the picture. George B. Selts directed.

YOUR INCOME TAX

Losses incurred in a taxpayer's trade or business or profession or in any transaction entered into for profit, not compensated for by insurance or otherwise, are deductible from gross income in determining net income upon which the income tax is assessed. To be allowed, losses not incurred in trade, business, or profession, must conform closely to the wording of the statute. For example, a loss incurred in the sale of a taxpayer's home or automobile, which at the time of purchase was bought with the intention of resale, is not deductible, because it was not a transaction "entered into for profit." Losses sustained in the operation of a farm as a business venture are deductible. If sustained in the operation of a farm operated merely for the pleasure of the taxpayer, they are not deductible.
