Chicago Orders Million Gallons of Ocean Water

CHICAGO, Mar. 17. (AP).—A lot of the sea—one million gallons of genuine ocean water—is to be shipped to Chicago.

Synthetic salt water lacks the organic content and chemical constituents of real ocean water, without which salt water fish cannot live, Mr. Morse said.

The entire shipment will require 125 railroad tank cars having a capacity of 8,000 gallons each.
