

SENATE RACE ENTRY IS WET

SALEM, Ore., Mar. 18. (AP)—Multnomah county, comprising the third Oregon congressional district is to have a wet candidate for the republican congressional nomination in the person of Norman R. Richards, an attorney. Richards filed his declaration today. He believes in prohibition of saloons, but modification of existing prohibiting law and amendments and for governmental regulation.

His platform says: "If nominated and elected, I will during my term of office be opposed to any dry prohibition in any form. I will stand for a modification of all prohibition amendments to the constitution of the United States and of this state, and for a modification of all prohibition laws."

"I believe in the prohibition of all saloons and the governmental regulation and control of the liquor traffic."

"If you will take the money and graft from the liquor business that would be the end of the problem. These things should greatly reduce the cost of government and the present excessive taxes."

M. E. BISHOP ON TRIAL TODAY IN DENMARK COURT

COPENHAGEN, Denmark, Mar. 18. (AP)—The prosecutor in the trial of the Rev. Dr. Anton Hest, Methodist Episcopal bishop for Scandinavia today began his argument on the second point of the indictment charging the bishop with making public appeals for charity based on "more or less shamelessly falsified accounts."

The prosecutor stated that during a portion of nine years, 2,500,000 kroner (1655,000) were received as contributions by the central mission, and that of this sum only 500,000 kroner (\$131,000) were actually paid for the relief of poor people.

Farm Pointers

Whitewashing the inside of the dairy barn aids in the production of clean milk, says the Oregon Experiment station.

It is best to take the cows off pastures infested with onions, garlic and other weeds hours before milking time, notes the Oregon experiment station.

Oregon cow testing association records show that the purchased bull is the better half of the dairy herd, reports the college extension service.

The following list of "don'ts" is given by the O. A. C. dairy department: Forget to wipe the cow's udder and flanks before milking; milk with wet hands; run cold milk through the separator; forget to cool the cream immediately after separation is completed; mix warm and cold cream; put milk or cream into dirty vessels; forget to wash the separator after each separation; separate the milk without first straining it; fail to operate the separator according to directions; expect the cream run to reach destinations unless it is plainly addressed; feed dusty hay or ill-scented feeds; milk before milking; expect the milk or cream to be cooler than the surroundings where it is kept; skim too thin cream; expect to get top price for cream unless cows, stable, udders, separator, and milkers are kept clean; forget that there is good money in dairying if it is properly done.

Progressive sheep growers in Oregon now using paper twine to tie the fleeces, as wool tied with twine sells more readily than similar wool tied with twine of jute, hemp, or similar fibers. Fragments of paper twine come out of the wool in the scouring process. Other twines leave bits of vegetable fibers, which are removed from the finished cloth only by expensive hand labor. If the use of paper twine were universal it would be a distinct advantage to owners of farm flocks, says the extension service.

BAR SCHOOL DANCES

Two Rescued from Mine Near Wallace, Idaho

WALLACE, Ida., Mar. 18. (AP)—Charles McMurray and Dan Knappenberg, miners trapped on the 1500-foot level of the Morning mine for more than 36 hours were rescued shortly after midnight this morning.

Rescue workers penetrated the final six feet of rock and debris in less than an hour and the two men were taken from the mine tunnel uninjured. They were trapped by a cave-in Tuesday afternoon when walls of a tunnel in which they were working collapsed. George Shown, another miner, escaped at the time of the cave-in.
