Trade Figures Disclose Alaska Good Investment

JUNEAU, Alaska, Mar. 18. (AP)—Trade figures compiled by John C. Melville, collector of customs for the territory, show that Alaska, for which the United States in 1876 paid \$2,000,000, exported \$22,223,726 worth of products in 1925 alone. The territory closed the year with a favorable trade balance of \$29,024,224. There was an increase of \$1,825,133 in the total value of merchandise shipped from and into Alaska.

The territory's total commerce was \$35,422,246, of which \$25,199,511 was imported and the balance exported.
