Rudolph Valentino has made of "Cobra" a photograph of strong and adult emotions. The theme has been treated sincerely and intelligently. The picture opened yesterday at the Arcade theater and held the tense interest of the large audience.

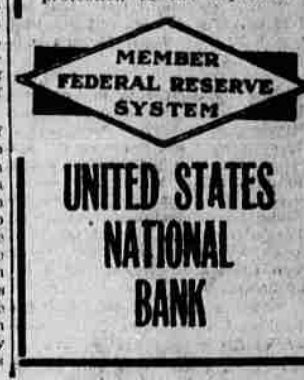
