Monster Settings Are Used in "The Wanderer"

The largest motion picture set ever constructed and the greatest number of persons ever used for one scene in an American made motion picture are two of the outstanding features of "The Wanderer," famous Biblical spectacle, which Raoul Walsh directed for Paramount, and which opens a four days' run at the Star on Sunday.

The scene, which is that of an unnamed Biblical city, was built in the foothills of Santa Monica, California, and covers many hundred acres of ground. More than two hundred carpenters and scores of technical assistants were at work for more than three weeks constructing the hundred massive buildings and walls for the set. For the scene depicting the destruction of the city by earthquake and fire, thousands of actors were used as well as hundreds of lions, tigers, elephants and camels.
