(By Sister Mary) Breakfast—Canned pears, cereal, thin cream, creamed dried beef with rice, graham toast, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Spilt pea soup, croquettes, fruit puff puddings, milk tea. Dinner—Browned sirloin steak, French fried potatoes, best greens, peach salad, maple mousse, sponge cake, whole wheat bread, milk, coffee.

Creamed Dried Beef Rice One-fourth pound dried beef, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 1/2 cups milk, 2 tablespoons grated cheese, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 2 hard cooked eggs, 2 cups hot rice.

Melt butter in frying pan. Add dried beef pulled into small pieces and cook until the edges frizzle. Sift flour over meat and stir with a fork until perfectly blended.
