"His People," At Arcade, A Human Epic

A great personality, heretofore unknown to the American screen, appears on film at the Arcade theater today and Tuesday. It is Rudolph Schildkraut, noted New York stage star, who makes his bow to American pictures with one of the screen's greatest performances in "His People," the Universal Jewel production now showing here.

An "Itabi Coninsky" in this intensely human picture, Schildkraut must be credited with one of the very few really great performances of the screen. His role is that of a Jewish rabbi—kind and forgiving, but at the same time proud and relentless in the keeping of his good name and his racial traits.

His struggles to uphold his native traditions, the grief and heartbreaks that his son brings him, his unceasing fight to provide a decent living for his family, make up a splendid story in which is blended pathos, tragedy and occasional touches of comedy.

Despite the dominance of the story by Mr. Schildkraut's remarkable performance, the other members of the large cast manage to make themselves effective in other roles.

Blanche Mahaffey, a comparatively newcomer to the screen, is lovely as the little Irish girl, and George Lewis, the juvenile, in his first real part, gives a polished performance as the young son of the rabbi, who is allowed because he himself is a prize-fighter.

Arthur Lubin as the ungrateful son, Rena Rosanova, as the mother, recalls "Humoresque," and Kate Price, Nat Carr, Otto Lederer, Bobby Gordon, Albert Bushalano, and others are pleasing in smaller roles.

No small part of the credit for this excellent picture is due to Edward Sloman, who directed it. He shows at all times a feeling for dramatic effect, combined with a sympathy with which he imbues his players.

He breaks through the drunken crowd that mocks him and goes to Tisha, whom he finds in the arms of Pharis. Bitterly he reproaches her with his damnation and leaves her. But the lure of the charmer is too strong for him and he is drawn back into the net. Tisha demands a proof of his love—he must renounce the goal of Jethers and swear to the town of Tola, at first revolted, at last yields.
