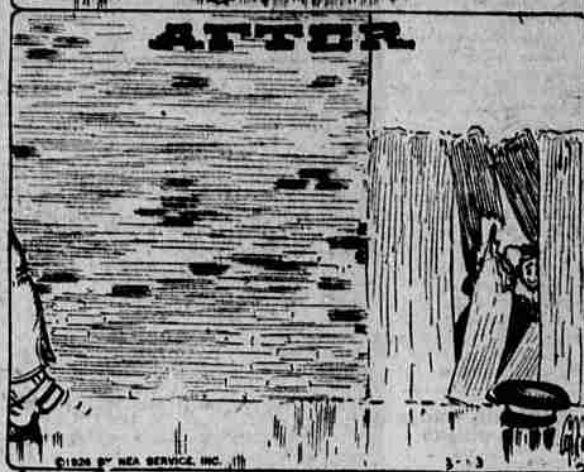

## Prodigal Son's Return Strong Scene on Screen

One of the most powerful dramatic effects ever achieved on the screen was filmed recently during the making of the scene showing the return of the prodigal son to his father's house in the production inspired by the famous Biblical parable.

The return of the prodigal son, after his weeks of disipation in the city with Ernest Torrence and Greta Nison, brought clearly to mind the exact significance of Christ's words when he told the parable to the Pharisees and Scribes.

"I have read the story of the prodigal son many times," said one clergyman who viewed the scene, "but never before has the real pathos and dramatic force of this particular incident struck home. Raoul Walsh has found true inspiration in the parable."
