Tall annuals for the back—cosmos, miniature sunflowers known as cucumerifolia or cucumber-leaved sorts; plummy cocombers, flowering tobacco or nicotiana, and the tall, slender, elegant African marigolds, tall snapdragons, tall plants such as the American beauty type cornflowers, scabiosa or mourning brides, and groups of sweet peas trained on brush or cylindrical of poultry wire. These make stunning groups so arranged with other annuals.

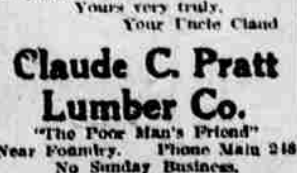
Medium height—calendula or not marigold, larkspurs, balsams, intermediate snapdragons, most of the asters, petunias except the dwarf types, Shirley poppies with upward facing for the back, ten inch stocks, calliopsis.

Lower growing for the edge—the compact petunias, nasturtiums, helix drumhead, California poppies, pinks, ageratum lobelia, dwarf marigolds, mignonette, and Virginia stocks.
