Britts Has High Hopes For Comedy

John Britts, director of the Portland Light Opera company who will produce the musical comedy "The Time, the Place and the Girl," here April 8 at the Arcade theatre, has come to Portland after three days spent in La Grande, working with the cast and chorus to take part in the production.

Mr. Britts has been in Portland for the past six years, connected with the Orpheum theatre there and director of the light opera company. He is also an excellent pianist and plays first cello in the Portland Symphony orchestra. Previous to coming to Portland Mr. Britts was located in New York, working with the Schubert, the A-1 Opera company and many other first class companies. During his career he has directed eighty-nine operas and musical comedies.

Mr. Britts came to La Grande upon special request of Mrs. J. A. Hastings, director of the Monday Musical here, under whose auspices "The Time, the Place and the Girl" is being given. "I am taken up with your little town which I had never seen until three days ago," he said last evening. "I am very happy with what I found here and look forward to an excellent show. I only hope that the people of the community realize what it is going to be," he said.

In speaking of the personnel of the cast and chorus for the show he said: "I have never run across anything better than the cast here, not even among professional players. As for the choruses, they are very good looking, but need much practice and work yet to come up to the equal of the cast."

Baked Eggs, Piquant
Six hard cooked eggs, 1/2 onion, 2 tablespoons butter, one half cup cream, 2 eggs, 2 tablespoons minced parsley, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, 1/2 cup fine toasted bread crumbs, 1/2 lemon.

Melt butter and add onion cut in shreds. Cook until the onion is a deep yellow. Cut hard eggs in halves lengthwise. Add cream to onion and pour this over the eggs arranged in a well-buttered baking dish. Beat eggs until very stiff and add parsley, salt, pepper, crumbs and the juice of lemon. Pour this mixture over contents of baking dish, cover dish and bake in a moderate hot oven until set. It will take about 30 minutes.

This can also be cooked in a chafing dish. The onion is cooked directly over the flame in the blazer, eggs and cream added and the beaten egg mixture poured over. The pan is then covered and set over hot water to finish cooking. When the eggs are "set" the dish is done.

The Garden

Set an old window or sash over the rhubarb, bank it up around the edges and bring on an early planting pie.

Sow zinnias, petunias, anemones and marigolds for early bloom. Don't get the seeds too thick, and transplant as soon as the seedlings will stand it.

Parley always takes its time about coming up. Better drop a short row in the cold frame for an early summer garnish.

Keft had started now will be ready for the table in July.

Don't forget that the earlier you get Lima beans started the more Lima you can harvest. Four beans to a five-inch pot planted edge down will start you on the way to an early Lima crop.

Cardinal Chamber seed needs a warm indoor start if you want the vines to bloom early. It should be planted outside until the weather is warm.
