"Stage Struck," Gloria's Latest, Coming to Arcade

"Stage Struck," an Allan Dwan production for Paramount starring Gloria Swanson at the Arcade Theatre starting Thursday for a three-day run, is unique in that the first and final sequences are done in natural colors, the color being used to suggest the periods of happiness in the life of the heroine.

"Stage Struck" is the story of a drab little waitress in an Ohio river town who determines to become an actress because the boy who fries the wheat cakes in the restaurant flirts with her. She makes her debut on an Ohio river show boat, a locale seldom if ever used in pictures before. To take these show boat scenes, Miss Swanson, Mr. Dwan and a company of 100 journeyed to New Martinsville, W. Va., and remained there two weeks.

The little waitress, as played by Miss Swanson, is both humorous and pathetic. She is a bedraggled, down-in-the-holes little figure, always getting into trouble and always being the butt for the laughter of everyone. But something touching about the girl, something that keeps the tear close behind the laugh. The scenes on the boat and in the cheap restaurant are "shapely" comedy, and Miss Swanson reveals comedy gifts hitherto unexplored.

All these laugh-getting sequences are photographed in black and white. The opening sequence, however, shows the dream of the waitress. She is the world's greatest actress. She is being received by kings and queens. Vast audiences rise and cheer her when she plays "Salome" or "Cassim".

All this in color, one of the most gorgeous pieces of Technicolor work ever done. It is photographed in vivid crimson, gold and purple, the great banquet hall, set being especially striking. This fades into the shabby waitress in the cheap restaurant, only to come back to color again for the final shots when the waitress and the wheat cake cook, happily married, have their own restaurant—a lunch wagon—set in the midst of a garden of their own making.

In the cast with Miss Swanson are Ford Sterling, as the manager of the show boat; Lawrence Gray, as the flackjack tapper, and Gertrude Astor, as the blonde leading woman on the boat.

Director Joseph Frank, who made the Pete Morrison starring vehicle "Blue Blazes," now playing at the Star Theatre, seems to have captured the secret of excellent Western films.

Not once in the entire length of the picture does the action lag. In fact, the story starts at even a more rapid tempo than most Westerns and speeds up through a veritable whirlwind of action as crisis after crisis builds up to a tremendously effective climax.

The picture contains some well-timed comedy which the director injected into the story at just the right time for the biggest laughs and a happy audience in the lobby of the theatre after the show in any criterion this picture has created more of a success than any picture shown here for many weeks.

The heroine, Barbara Starr, adds a bit of femininity to the picture, and her dainty loveliness contrasts strikingly with Morrison's rugged handomeness.

Beautiful scenic shots are included in the picture and there is plenty of variety in the offering to please every type of fan. The nature lover, the action lover, the lover of beautiful women garbed in the attractive costume of the outdoors, the lover of mystery and the lover of a good tale well told all find what they want in this picture.
