**CRUICKSHANK LEADS FIELD**

PINEHURST, N. C., Apr. 2. (AP)—Bobby Cruickshank, the professional whose eleventh hour failures are almost as famous in golf as Walter Hagen's victories, this morning leads the field in the north and south open championship, with 145 for the first half of the 72-hole medal play.

Two strokes behind were Jack Hutchinson, of Chicago, and Arthur Yates, of Rochester, N. Y., who holds the north and south amateur title. The first ten included Marjorie Smith, Tommy Armour, Hagen, Bill Mehlhorn, John Goleha, August Nordone and Tom Harmon.

**Suzanne Lenglen Will Wed Composer's Son**

PARIS, Apr. 2. (AP)—Suzanne Lenglen is engaged to be married to Jacques Heintzmann Offenbach, poet and critic and grandson of Jacques Offenbach, the famous composer of the "Tales of Hoffman," it was learned today.

The temperamental queen of the courts chose her intended husband outside the ranks of tennis players, but M. Offenbach is considered one of the most delightful poets of the younger generation of French letters.

In spite of official denials, M. Lenglen is known, during the last five years, to have favored upon the proposals of dukes, counts, earls and American millionaires.

This engagement is hailed as a real love match. Suzanne will be 27 years old May 24 while Offenbach is 34.

**JAKE SCHAEFFER LEADING HOPPE IN TITLE MATCH**

NEW YORK, Apr. 2. (AP)—Jake Schaeffer, who tore the 13.2 balk line billiard crown from the head of Willie Hoppe, is making a serious threat upon the 13-1 diamond.

With only four blocks of their 1600-point title match to play, Schaeffer led by 2400 to 2070. In the two blocks yesterday he established a new world's high run of 241, adding 22 in his first inning of the evening to the 219 with which he finished the afternoon contest.
