Billy Evans Says:

What is the physical condition of First Baseman Joe Hauser of the Athletics?

Joe Hauser is the big question mark of baseball. He is the player whom the experts dwell on in discussing the chances of the Athletics to win a pennant.

The ability of Hauser to play regularly seems to be the point on which the experts hinge the rise or fall of Connie Mack's club.

This much is certain—Joe Hauser will not be used regularly at first base. Such a thing might be possible, but Connie Mack, who looks farther ahead than 1924 and who has much thought for Hauser's career, doesn't intend it to be that way.

"Instead of Poole helping out Hauser at first, it will probably be Hauser helping Poole," is the way Manager Mack tells the story.

In practice Hauser has put the knee to every possible test except sliding.

At times he notices soreness in certain spots, but that is to be expected.

POOLE TO START

Hauser would like to go every day but in all probability Poole will start at first base with Hauser resting into the lineup against certain kinds of pitching or when Poole begins to slump.

Physicians are agreed that there is no better way to strengthen the injured knee than by putting it to all the tests a first baseman must undergo in handling various types of thrown and batted balls.

However, to overdo the work this year might permanently ruin the chances for a complete recovery.

The opinion seems to be that Hauser should be brought back by a slow process of conditioning.

For that reason, hitting in pinches and helping Poole at first base will probably be the extent of Joe's activities this year.

It is possible he might be saved for the long stretch should the A's be in the running.

Three World Champions To Perform in Chicago

CHICAGO, Apr. 9. (AP)—Charles Hoff, armed with a new bamboo replacing the one he recently lost, will seek to set his world's pole vault record another notch higher at the eighth annual American Institute of Bankers' track and field games here tonight.

The Norwegian is one of three world's record holders who will compete in the events. Loren Storchson, international champion, at indoor sprinting, and Dehart Hubbard, Washington's holder of the international broad jump record are the other two.

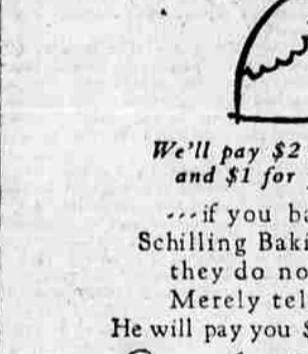

SEARCHING FOR MISSING BODIES

NEW ORLEANS, Apr. 9. (AP)—Searchers today continued their task of searching for bodies of more than 35 sailors who are believed to have lost their lives in two Mississippi river disasters in the New Orleans district yesterday and last night. Authorities believed it possible that the death list will not be as large as had been expected.

Several boats today entered their activities near Pointe La Pêche, La., about 40 miles below New Orleans, where the Dutch steamer Silvanus last night collided with the Standard Oil company's tanker Thomas H. Wheeler. Early today 20 members of the crew of the Silvanus were unaccounted for. None of the Thomas H. Wheeler seamen were found injured.

Tanker Blasts Fatal

Five men were officially reported as missing, another unaccounted for by relatives and two critically hurt as a result of five oil explosions aboard the Standard Oil tanker steamer O. Warning in a dry dock here yesterday.

Shortly after the Dutch and American ships collided a severe explosion occurred aboard the foreign owned tanker, which was found for London with a cargo of benzine. A few minutes later the vessel ran against a bank and a minor explosion followed. The impact with the earth plunged the tanker back into the stream. It was caught in the current and carried down the river eleven miles before burning to the waters and sinking.

Members of the crew of the Thomas H. Wheeler were successful in their efforts to extinguish a blaze which originated in the accident. The Thomas H. Wheeler was beached.
